The Week at S.D.U.

With one-half our semester gone, we once more assume our studies to begin a new year—1954. To many this is just another year but to the present student body but to the former St. Dunstan's students who are scattered throughout the country 1954 will be a memorable year. It will be memorable because the Commencement Exercises next May will mark the one-hundredth graduating class to pass through the doors of St. Dunstan's. When we review the history of St. Dunstan's from the day eighteen students enrolled in a one roomed building to the present day when the enrollment nears three-hundred, plus our modern conveniences we see that our college has progressed tremendously. In view of this it is quite understandable why we should rejoice and give due respect to the occasion. In this matter everything is in readiness and the Centennial Day will be officially opened on January 19th when Provincial High Mass will be celebrated by Most Reverend Maurice Roy, D.D., Ph. D., Archbishop of Quebec. Since many students will be unable to attend the main centennial celebration in August, the sermon will be given by Right Reverend J. A. Murphy, D.D., who was Rector of St. Dunstan's from 1926 to 1942.
