COLEMAN CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING

The annual meeting of the Coleman-Milo Church of Scotland congregation was held in the Kirk, Coleman, on Monday, June 5th, at 8:30 p.m., with Rev. J. H. Bishop, minister of the congregation, acting as chairman. The financial report by the Secretary - Treasurer, Rankine Wallace, showed the congregation to be in a healthy financial position, a large balance being on hand in the treasury. It was agreed that the newly elected trustees be authorized to have work begin immediately on raising the church and in having a new foundation placed under the church and tower, with all

necessary repairs. Report of the work done in the congregation's cemetery in Milo, revealed that extensive work had been done this spring in cleaning, levelling, etc. the cemetery, with the erection of a new fence. A chart of the cemetery was drawn up by Messrs. Bradford MacKay and Albert Milligan. This chart is now being blueprinted. The congregation is to purchase a power lawn mower and appoint a caretaker for the cemetery. The trustees, Bradford MacKay, George MacNeven, and Wilbur MacQuarrie, with the Secretary-Treasurer, were appointed to attend the annual meeting of the Parish to be held at DeSable, June 27th. The Women's Auxiliary of Cole-

man, which was organized at the beginning of this year, purchased a new pulpit cloth, carpets for the church, and intend to have the church painted after the necessary repairs have been completed. The Ladies' Missionary Society of Milo, organized last Autumn, is to co-operate with the Coleman's Women's Auxiliary regarding church re-decoration. Both Women's groups gave large contributions to the Radio Broadcast of The Church of Scotland Hour. The Communion services are to be held in Coleman, August 6th. Coleman S. S. showed good attendance and splendid work under Mr. John MacKinnon, Superintendent.

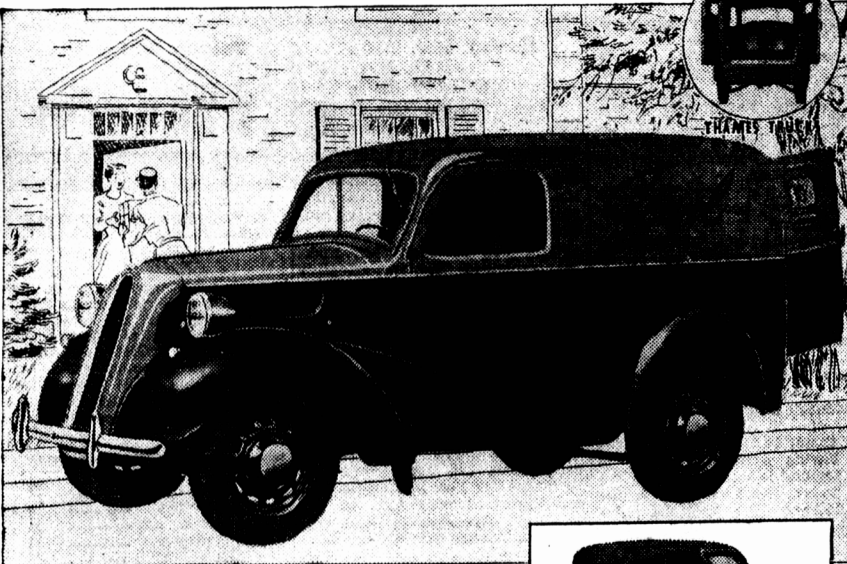
