NEW YORK (AP)—Two more selling waves assailed stock market prices Wednesday. The market rallied one but lost gains in the second.

Wall Street paid scant heed to Treasury secretary Dillon's statement that the stock market rally would be short-lived.

Not buying. A lot of people are just letting the selling run itself out. They have clear signs that this happened, they're not doing much more.

Another said that the market is anticipating a falling-off in business this autumn—a drop-off caused, in part, by the decline of the stock market itself.

His sudden passing came as a great shock to all who knew him.

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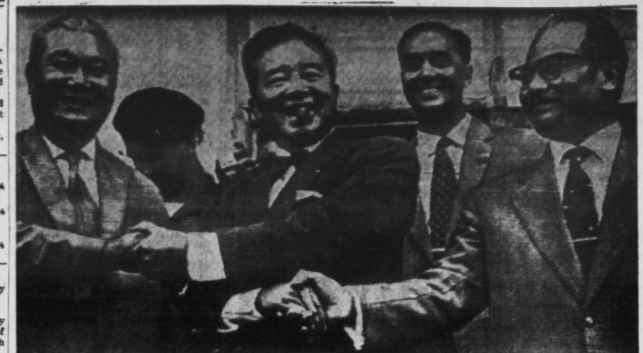
