Our Ice Boat Service.

OTTAWA, June 8. The returns in connection with the ice boat service between Capes Tormentina and Traverse have been laid before Parliament. The returns, which were brought down at the request of Mr. Perry, show that the first trip this year was made on the 24th February, and was from that date to the 12th April 45 trips had been made each way. The total number of mail bags carried was 5,541; total number of passengers carried, 83; total receipts, \$266; expenditures, \$4,912; outstanding accounts, \$1,206; total expenditure, \$5,118.

The Dominion's Finances.

OTTAWA, June 8. The financial returns for last month show a total revenue for May of \$3,057,240. The customs revenue is \$200,000 and the excise \$200,000 better than last year for the same month. The balance now stands at \$2,866,700 for eleven months worse than last year. Minister's estimate for the year was that the balance would be \$3,000,000 for the twelve months. But the present signs are that he will come out more than half a million better than his estimate.

To be Made Cardinals.

LONDON, June 8. The Post publishes a despatch from Rome saying that it is semi-officially announced that Mgr. Satolli and Archbishop Haller, of Baltimore, will be made Cardinals at the next Papal Consistory.
