

Current Notes.

A British commission is about to reconstruct the fiscal system of the West Indies.

Rain re-commenced falling on Monday. The Danube is again rising, and it is feared will break through the Florisdorf Dikes.

Advices from Capetown to the national board of health state that during the past two months nine thousand people in that port have been affected with small-pox, of whom twenty-four hundred died.

The troubles between the Montreal boot and shoe manufacturers and the lasters are practically over. The strikers, with few exceptions, have signed a document agreeing not to interfere with the masters in the engaging of apprentices or labor of any kind, and in most of the factories work was resumed on Tuesday morning last.

Information was received at Montreal on the 13th ult. that a farmer named Hout was killed in the village of Arthabaskville, Quebec, by two men named Chabot, senior and junior, the latter of whom plunged a knife into Hout's groin. The alleged reason for the crime was that Hout has used some filthy language to Chabot's mother as she was passing on the street. The dreadful deed was committed in the presence of several witnesses who accompanied the slayers. The accused are arrested.

The Herald publishes a statement of the arrival at Halifax during the past year. The total number is 8,723, of whom 4,970 were males, 2,086 females, and 1,667 children:—Nationalities—English, 5,597; Irish, 999; Scotch, 314; Germans, 39; Scandinavians, 1,565; French and Belgians, 6; Other Countries, 3. Trades and Occupations.—Farmers, 248; Farm and general laborers, 4,345; Mechanics, 287; Clerks, Trades, etc., 90; Female servants 790. General Destination.—Nova Scotia, 1,431; New Brunswick, 230; P. E. Island, 2; Quebec, 3,790; Ontario, 1,006; Manitoba, 761; British Columbia, 2; Eastern States, 99; Western States, 1,402.

An English paper says that "not since the vote of credit of £6,000,000 was passed during the Russia-Turkish war has such activity prevailed at Sheerness dockyard as at the present time. A large portion of the establishments are working over time, and extra men, who are promised work until April next, are being taken on daily." This indicates an intention to be ready for war, whether any is expected or not. England feels the necessity of maintaining her naval superiority, and the efforts of other powers to create fleets force her to build still larger ones. The command of the ocean leaves her at liberty to dispense with a large standing army.

The city of Monterey in Mexico, has a picturesque feature. In the very heart of the city, from a sunken space half a block square and twenty feet below the grade of the streets, a wonderful spring wells up and pours a stream to which all the washerwomen of the place come as a common laundry and do their washing. Out from an overhanging rock, right up through a tangle of white pebbles, the water bursts forth like a little geyser; and all over the sunken space are other smaller springs which collectively more than equal the output of the great one. From them altogether comes enough water, flowing with a good current, to fill a channel 12 feet wide and four feet deep.

The servant girl question is being discussed in Moncton. A lady whose domestic is taking her Xmas vacation remarks that the subject which most engrosses the minds of the Moncton ladies at present is what are we to do for servants. Our factories are taking from us all our girls, who, for the last five years have been of a very inferior quality, but now we find, when even they are not to be procured, that they were considerably better than none. In discussing the matter with other perplexed housekeepers, I hear that the Frederickton people, being in the same sad predicament as ourselves, have applied to the mother country for assistance, and in answer to the demand over one hundred good servants have been sent to their relief.

In a city in Texas, a Jumping Jack was placed on a Christmas Tree for a Miss Foreman. Her friends took it as an insult and bloodied then and there was prevented with difficulty. It was claimed Arthur Shadinger put the toy on the tree. On Wednesday evening, her three brothers, her brother-in-law, James Johnson, and her lover, Thomas Cooper, went to a prayer meeting where they knew Shadinger would be. After service they assaulted him, driving him back into the school house. Shadinger's friends came to the rescue. On being armed with a revolver Cooper fired three shots at Shadinger, mortally wounding him. As he fell Shadinger, shot one of the Foremans. The battle went on, the ladies screaming and endeavoring to stop the bloodshed. Nearly all the participants were wounded, some seriously. Three arrests were made; the others have taken to the woods.
