AN ISLANDER MARRIED

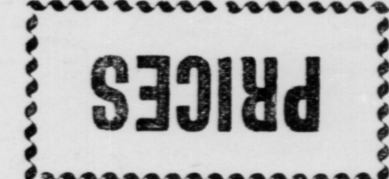
