40 Million Boost Looms For Eastern Nova Scotia

HALIFAX (CP) — The Nova Scotia forest products industry may soon get a \$40,000,000 boost that could transfuse new economic blood into the eastern end of the province. Premier Robert L. Stanfield says negotiations between the province and Swedish-backed Nova Scotia Pulp Limited appear to be nearing a successful conclusion. The company has found engineering and technical surveys for a proposed chemical pulp mill to be "very satisfactory." All that remains are the financial arrangements.
