

# Falcons Chalk Up Second Victory In City Baseball League

Northwest Falcons chalked up their second straight win in City Baseball League play when they gained a close 1-0 verdict over East End Stars at Memorial Field last evening. The game was called after seven innings.

The victory gives the Falcons sole possession of the league leadership with a one-game bulge over Northeast Rovers. It was Stars' second defeat in as many league starts.

Second baseman Lorne Hennessey scored the only run of the game in the top half of the sixth on Buck Whitlock's single with two men out. Hennessey got on base and found to second on short stop Gus Flynn's double error, made third on Whitlock's single and came home on the throw-in. The side retired when Whitlock was tagged by Maurice Williams, a run-down between second and third.

The highlight feature of the game was the pitching duel between lanky Wendell "Gump" Gillis of Falcons and Ev Began of the Stars. Both boys were making their first appearances of the season and came up with sharp hurling.

Although allowing six hits, Gillis did some nice clutch-pitching on two different occasions, when those hits had him in tight spots, to come out on top the winner with no runs scored. Began pitched steady ball all the way to give up only three hits, strike out seven and walk three. Gillis had five strike outs, walked two and hit one batter.

It was a close, well-played contest all the way that gave a small crowd of fans the best calibre of ball witnessed in league play so far this season.

Proving himself one of the sharpest batters of the league, Gus Flynn of Stars came up with the long hit of the game in the second frame when he sent one into deep centre for a three-base Yuhus, Hahn (7) and Bucha; Drows and Anderson.

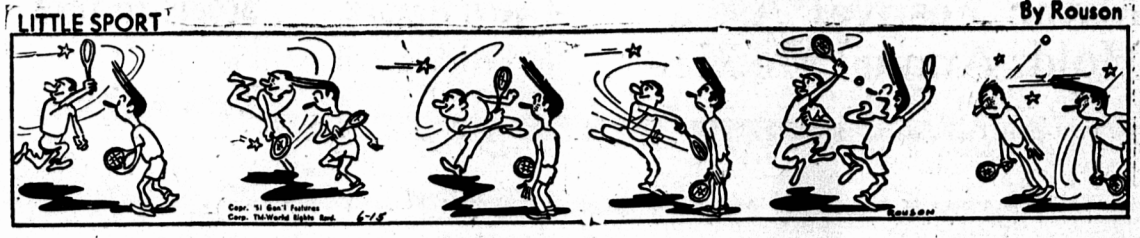

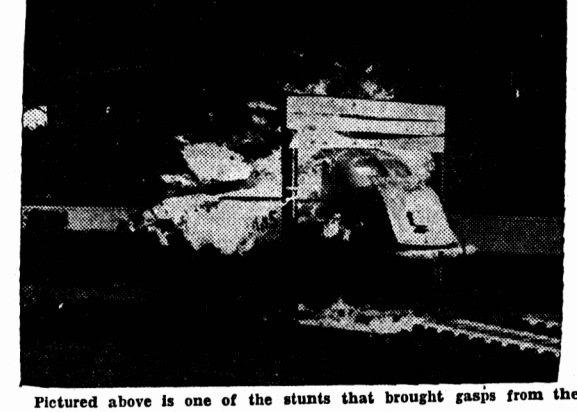


# Poulton Wins By TKO Over Durelle At Moncton

The high-flying Chicago White Sox built their American League lead to 4 1-2 games by sweeping a twilight-night doubleheader from Washington Senators 3-1 and 14-5 Thursday night.

The amazing White Sox there-by registered their 44th and 15th consecutive road victories, leaving them one short of the American League record set by the Senators in 1912 and two shy of the major league mark established by the Giants in 1916.

The second-place Yankees were idle Thursday.

Cleveland used the home run as its offensive weapon in defeating Philadelphia Athletics 3-1 in another night game. Ray Boone and Jim Hegan pounded round-trippers which paved the way for Bob Lemon's seventh American League decision.

Tehan alleged he was struck by Charles' car while it was being driven by Mrs. Lucille Belle Ferguson, who also is named in the suit.

The accident occurred during a celebration after Charles won the heavyweight championship in a 15-round bout with Jersey Joe Walcott in Chicago in 1949.

# Brooklyn Dodgers Edge St. Louis Cardinals 2-1

(By The Canadian Press) Brooklyn Dodgers pulled one out of the fire in the ninth inning Thursday, edging St. Louis Cardinals 2-1 on Gil Hodges' two-out, two-run homer.

Hodges' blast, his 20th, ruined a brilliant pitching job by Joe Presko, plus sized rookie right-hander. Duke Snider singled with two down and rode home behind Hodges' sock into the left field bleachers.

The Cards collected 15 hits off Ralph Branca and Carl Erskine but their offence was nullified by poor base running, sluggishness on the base paths and heads-up baseball by Dodger catcher Roy Campanella.

By winning, the Dodgers remained six games in front of the second-place New York Giants in the National League. The Giants defeated Cincinnati Reds 11-6 in other games, Pittsburgh Pirates crushed Boston Braves 9-4, and the Philadelphia Phils trounced Chicago Cubs 11-3.

In the fifth the Cards collected three singles but failed to score. Catcher Roy Campanella broke up the rally by picking Presko and Red Schoendienst off second.

The Cards threatened again in the eighth loading the bases with two out on singles by Nippy Jones, Presko and Stan Rojek. But Erskine got Schoendienst to ground out to end the threat.

Larry Jansen, aided by a 16-hit attack, turned in his seventh victory for the Giants. Jansen stopped the Reds on seven hits including home runs by Grady Hatton and Bobby Adams.

Hank Thompson and rookie Willie Mays led the Giant assault, accounting for seven hits. Thompson and Mays each drove in three runs.

Little Murray Dickson turned in his eighth victory for the tall-end Pirates in stopping the Braves. Dickson scattered 10 hits including Sid Gordon's tenth homer. The Pirates jumped Vern Bickford for five runs in the fourth inning and never were headed. Wally Westlake drove in four runs on his 16th homer and two singles.

Russ Meyer also enjoyed heavy batting support as he pitched the 15th round bout, scheduled for 10:00 p. m. EDT. But that doesn't include theatre-television on a special closed circuit to six cities. That will be held as scheduled.

If Louis beats Savold—and he's a 14-to-5 favorite—he'll get Charles in September, probably at Detroit. If he loses, he'll quit the ring.
