Cubs Top Braves Bums Blank Bucs

The victory, ending the Dodgers' losing string at three, pushed them past Milwaukee Braves by .002 percentage points and left them a game behind the first place San Francisco Giants. The fourth place Pirates, who could have taken third with a victory, are three games behind. The Pirates' starting pitcher, Bob Friend, gave up only five hits in eight innings but was removed for a pinchhitter in the Pirate half of the eighth. Friend, seeking his 100th major league victory, was charged with the loss, his 11th compared to four victories.

WASHINGTON (AP) — Harmon Killebrew clouted his 31st home run Wednesday night as Washington won a rain-shortened five-inning game from Detroit 3-0 and moved past the Tigers into fifth place. Camillo Pascual allowed only one hit in the abbreviated contest, a fifth-inning single by Gus Zernial. It was Pascual's sixth straight victory and made his record for the year 10-7. Killebrew parked a Jim Bunning pitch into the left-center field seats in the first inning with the bases empty, hitting his 31st home run in Washington's 85th game of the season. In 1927 when Babe Ruth hit his record 60 homers, he didn't connect for No. 31 until the Yankees' 94th game.

Hobbie struck out three and walked five in drawing a round of applause from 22,206 Wrigley Field patrons.

INSULT TO INJURY
He added insult to injury in a two-run Cub fourth-inning when the Braves gave an intentional pass to Sammy Taylor, who had connected for his sixth homer of the season in the third, to get to Hobbie. Hobbie responded by whacking a single to left that scored Bobby Thompson from second.

Ernie Banks had tallied previously in the inning after walking, going to third on Thomson's single and coming home on Art Schult's sacrifice fly.

The Cubs picked up two more runs in the seventh on hits by Al Dark and Lee Walls, a stolen base and Banks' long fly.

BRAVES' FIRST RUN
Hank Aaron's first of two doubles—he now has 30 in all—and his theft of third base in the fourth inning set him up to score the Braves first run when Stan Lopata was thrown out at first. His double in the eighth brought home Eddie Mathews, who had walked.

In other National League action, San Francisco was at Philadelphia, Los Angeles at Pittsburgh and Cincinnati at St. Louis in night contests.

Cleveland's twin-bill with New York and Chicago's game at Boston were rained out in the American League, leaving night games in which Detroit was scheduled at Washington and Kansas City at Baltimore.

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Don Drysdale pitched a three-hit shut-out and drove in two runs Wednesday as Los Angeles Dodgers regained second place in the National League race with a 3-0 victory over Pittsburgh Pirates.
