It deals, too, with the magnificence of our Charlottetown harbor, the stateliness of our historic Legislature, with the fine tourist facilities at our National Park...

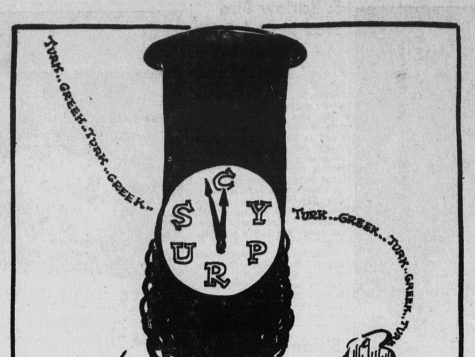
