New York Stocks
 NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market kept showing right on up to new peak levels last week, just as it has been doing for nearly nine months.
 There was some faltering, of course, and the market ended the holiday-shortened week right where it was a week ago.
 Nevertheless, The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was able during the four-day week to push up to a new high mark—the best level for the average since Oct. 25, 1929.
 Ever since the middle of September, the market has been coursing upward with little pauses now and then for consolidation of its gains. It was that kind of a situation again this week.
 It has been happening so often that some brokers are beginning to get a little restive about the possibility of a reaction that could attain sizable dimensions and still retrenchment of values.
 The market was closed on Monday for Memorial Day, and on Tuesday it advanced slightly with the aircrafts and non-ferrous metals strong. That took The AP average to its peak of the year, the best since Oct. 25, 1929. Wednesday's market was down a little, but on Thursday it regained the lost ground with the railroads

U. S. Steel Report

CLEVELAND (AP)—Steel production in the United States increased by half a point last week to 71 per cent of the rated capacity. Steel magazine said today.
 The gains of half a percentage point resulted from "continued completions of inventory reductions of steel and the generally stronger tone of business," the metal-working journal added.
 Ingot production, the magazine continued, is "still around 30 per cent below this time a year ago."
 "Practically none" of the gains came from buyers trying to protect themselves against a steel strike, the magazine said.
 "Steel's" composite on finished steel prices remained at \$113.70 a net ton, but the magazine noted that sellers are absorbing freight

Bandit Killed During Holdup

BIENVILLE, Que. (CP)—Police said a man was shot dead Thursday by the manager of the Caisse Populaire (credit union) here after a struggle behind the teller's cage during a reported attempted hold-up.
 Provincial police homicide squad men rushed to the scene of the shooting across the St. Lawrence river from Quebec City.
 Provincial police headquarters said the man, a Montrealer, entered the bank alone and asked the manager to change a 50-cent piece.
 After the manager did this, he asked for the bathroom. To get there he apparently had to get behind the teller's cage.
 Once there, first reports said, the man engaged in a struggle with the manager who reached for a revolver in a drawer and fired.
 The manager, identified only as a Mr. Samson, declined to give any details pending arrival of police.
 He said only that a man who attempted to commit a holdup was shot and killed.

Last of Princess Pats Coming Home

IN KOREA (CP)—The last segments of a famous Canadian regiment, the Princess Patricia's Canadian Light Infantry, are returning home.
 The army announced on Thursday that PPCLI men still serving in Korea and Japan—about 50—will return to Canada this month.
 Future postings of this theatre will be filled by soldiers whose parent units already are here. These are the Queen's Own Rifles of Canada, the Black Watch and the Canadian Guards.
 Other segments of the original 25th Brigade will be returned to Canada later. These include a handful of men from the Royal Canadian Regiment and the Royal 22nd Regiment.
 Their regiments were shipped back some months ago, but some had asked for extended duty and others, once getting back home, decided to volunteer for another tour of duty in this theatre.

 Previously, her gun crew bagged two targets while exercising with United States destroyers off southern Japan.
 The three Canadian destroyers are on a two-week island defence patrol of the Korean west coast.
 In the shooting competition, credit for two of the three bullet-credits for two of the three bullet-credits went to the Haida's three-inch 50-calibre weapon, and to the gun's director, PO Hugh Anderson, Verdun, Que.

STORMS HIT N. Y.

ALBANY, N. Y. (AP)—A broken trail of charred buildings and fallen trees lay today in the wake of wind-whipped thunderstorms that tore eastward across New York state Tuesday and claimed two lives. Hopes CNR Will Build Quebec Line

OTTAWA (CP)—Senator P. H. Bouffard (L.—Quebec) Thursday said he hopes Canadian National Railways will be able to build within the next year the easternmost section of a proposed rail line in Northern Quebec.
 He spoke in the Senate during consideration of a bill authorizing the government to grant the CNR \$38,750,000 for building a line between St. Felicien, on Lake St. John, to the Chibougamau gold mining area, 139 miles northeast.
 Senator Bouffard explained that because of guarantees of traffic for the western section of the line from Beattyville to Chibougamau construction will start immediately. No similar guarantees have been obtained for traffic on the eastern section from St. Felicien to Chibougamau and
