NEW YORK (AP) — Broadway's big one, My Fair Lady, closed Saturday night amid a tumultuous reception.

The two star roles were created by Rex Harrison and Professor Henry Higgins and Julie Andrews as Eliza Doolittle.

# Beef Prices Announced

Anticipated prices for the three top grades of beef steers for the week of October 6 are the same as last week for the Red and Blue brand animals, and 20 cents per hundredweight higher for Brown brand animals. It has been announced by J. Lincoln Dewar, secretary of the beef producers committee.

The price which is on a rail grade or dressed weight basis is \$48.25 for Red, \$47.25 for Blue and \$44.75 for Brown brand animals.

The prices are arrived at under a formula which has been agreed to by Canadian breeders here, and which beef breeders decided last summer to try out for one year.

Mr. Dewar suggested that at the announced rate for Brown brand steers on a rail grade basis, the quality of animal should work out approximately 250 to 300 hundred pounds. He was basing his estimate on the fact that this type of steer normally dressed at about 52 per cent of their live weight.

U.S. officials said all 20 countries in the area are expected to be invited to the meeting.
