News Notes.

Russia is threatened with another famine. There is severe frost in Germany and heavy snowfalls in Greece.

A real estate boom has struck the Canadian side of the Niagara River.

And now it is the orange crop which is short and prices will go up.

Bank dividends amounting to \$1,244,000 were payable in Montreal last Thursday.

Brewers in Germany are objecting strongly to the new taxes imposed on them by the government.

Welshmen are anxious to have Milford Haven made the terminus of the proposed West Atlantic service from Canada.

Chicago is filling up with tramps, vagabonds, paupers, crippled beggars and peddlers, thousands of unfortunates seeking work for which there is no demand.

The United States' life saving service cost \$1,000,235 for the past fiscal year. There are 242 stations, 48 of which are on the lakes. The efforts at rescuing life were successful in the cases of 2,969 persons, while 27 were drowned.

Our Girls as Successful Women.

A wealthy woman recently gave \$200,000 to establish a summer resort for poor mothers and their children. God bless her, this is only one instance among thousands where a woman has conceived and executed grand ideas.
