SAYS BERLIN COULD TOUCH OFF BIG WAR

Russian Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko is shown addressing the closing session of the Supreme Soviet (Parliament) in Moscow when he said the Berlin dispute could touch off a big war whose flames "would inevitably spread to the American continent." He also said the Soviet Union is ready to sign an agreement to end nuclear weapons tests. But he heaped scorn on Western insistence that such a pact be sealed by a foolproof inspection system. CNR Plans Co-ordinated Truck And Rail Shipments

MONTREAL (CP) - President N. R. Crump of the Canadian Pacific Railway Tuesday foreshadowed a revolutionary plan to streamline railway and truck freight shipments.

In his annual year-end statement, Mr. Crump said "top planning priority" is being given to co-ordinating rail and truck services for all merchandise shipments.

The aim, he said, is to provide "complete customer service on an integrated basis, streamlined, flexible and adapted to modern transportation requirements."

Mr. Crump did not fully spell out the CPR's plans. But he indicated the privately-owned railway is moving toward integration of its merchandise handling services by truck and rail, linking 17,000 miles of track with 10,000 route miles of truck operations.

N.S. Highways Department Undergoes Reorganization

HALIFAX (CP) - Nova Scotia Highways Minister Smith Thursday announced sweeping reorganization in the department's administrative staff.

The reorganization will include appointment of five divisional directors and six regional managers, and will affect all positions in organization, administration, methods of operation, facilities and equipment, to be used for all less than carload traffic.

The plan would involve all merchandise moved by rail or truck. The railway defines merchandise as less than carload lots in rail box cars, all express shipments and package freight on highway transports.

Cyprus Has Peaceful Christmas

NICOSIA (Reuters) - Governor Sir Hugh Foot Friday welcomed the first peaceful Christmas on Cyprus in five years but warned against over-optimism about the future.

There has been no terrorism in the island colony since the underground EOKA organization offered Christmas Eve to cease all violence if Britain stopped its operations against EOKA.

Foot said in an interview that over-optimism at this point could be "the great danger."

Informed British quarters said Britain's attitude of silence toward the offer does not imply indifference. They said it reflected an inclination not to commit the government at present to any binding pledge.

Stelco Workers Sign Agreement

TORONTO (CP) - United Steel workers of America (U.S.A.) Friday announced it has signed a three-year agreement with the Steel Company of Canada covering 2,500 workers at seven fabricating plants.

The benefits, a package in crease of 27.8 cents an hour and changes in seniority and grievance procedures, are similar to those won by 85,000 basic steel workers after an 84-day strike in Hamilton.

Steelworkers' director Larry Sefton said no strike threat was involved in the settlement for fabricating workers, employed at Montreal, Hamilton, Toronto, Brantford and Gananogue.
