Montreal Stocks Begin Month On Upswing

MONTREAL, (CP)—The stock market started the month on the upswing Monday as stocks extended last week's advance in slow trading. Steels, utilities and carriers were up but papers and miscellaneous industrials showed a slightly weaker trend. Senior metals, regular while banks held steady.

Canadian Javelin pushed ahead for a gain of five cents to \$4.50 on volume of 17,350 shares. Other issues moving sharply to the upside included Canada Steamship, General Motors, Aluminium, Canadian Breweries, Brazili-Can, Donahue Canadian Celanese, Asbestos Corporation, Fraser, International Nickel, Algoma and CFR.

Mines were irregular in a 10-cent range. Anacon, Chimo and Grandines advanced while Dominion Asbestos, Inspiration and New Larder slipped. Western oils held steady.

Of the 187 issues traded, 81 were up, 53 down and 53 unchanged, with eight new highs and five new lows established for the year. The exchange's closing averages showed banks unchanged at 34.04; utilities up 0.2 at 94.3; industrials off 1.2 at 190.0; papers off 2.46 at 692.93 and goods off 0.10 at 57.07.

MANCHESTER, Eng. (Reuters)—The highest-voltage electric transformer ever built in Britain—it has a capacity of more than 220,000 volts—leaves today on the first leg of its journey to Kitimat, B.C. It is one of seven being built by the Aluminimum Company of Canada's new 1,600,000-horsepower hydro-electric power station at Kitimat.

N. Y. Stocks In Fourth Straight Advance Monday

NEW YORK, (AP)—The stock market rolled up its fourth straight advance Monday. It now is well up from the low point of the year reached two months ago in the nervous decline brought on by early Korean truce proposals.

Some market observers believe that the long-awaited summer rally has started. Railroads, steels and motors were prominent in the rise Monday. There was plenty of supporting action from oils, coppers, aircrafts, distillers and radio-televisions.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks gained 40 cents at \$109.20. The industrial component was up 50 cents, railroads up 10 cents and utilities up 20 cents. Graham-Paige was the day's most active issue unchanged at 1 1/4 with 16,300 shares traded. It was followed by American Telephone up 1/4 at 155, and the Baltimore and Ohio up 3/4 at 26 1/2.

Higher were Santa Fe, Texas Co., Western Union, Union Carbide, American Woolen, General Motors, Boeing, Lockheed, National Distillers, Philco, Radio Corp. and American Gas and Electric.

Canadian issues were mixed. Canadian Pacific was up 3/4 and Hiram Walker added 1/4. International Nickel slipped 1/4 while both Dome Mines and Distillers Seagram lost 1/4.

On the American Stock Exchange Canadian issues were lower. Giant Yellowknife and Royalty Oil both fell 1/4.

Would End Diversion Of Two Rivers

WASHINGTON, (CP)—The House of Representatives foreign affairs committee asked the state department Monday to end a 1940 executive agreement with Canada providing for diversion of two rivers from Hudson Bay into Lake Superior.

The diversion, opposed by representative Harold Otertag (Rep. N.Y.), adds 5,000 cubic feet of water a second to the levels of the Great Lakes. The two rivers are the Long Lac and the Ogoki.

The agreement, a wartime emergency measure, permitted Canada to increase the output of hydroelectric energy at its Niagara Falls, Ont., plants. The agreement has no termination date.

Otertag contends the flow of the two rivers should be placed under the jurisdiction of the international joint commission, a body which adjudicates boundary matters between the two countries.

The committee's request was contained in a letter to secretary of state Dulles.

At Ottawa, Gen. A. G. L. McNaughton, chairman of the International Joint Commission, declined to comment on the suggested changes to the agreement.

Franc Area Has Trade Deficit

PARIS, (AP)—The French ministry of finance in a report issued Monday said the franc area has a trade deficit of \$52,000,000 in 1952. The deficit was \$406,000,000 less than that reported for 1951, but \$414,000,000 greater than that of 1950.

The improvement in 1952, the report said, was due largely to a decline in imports and a world-wide decline in prices, as well as a decrease in the purchases of raw materials from abroad.

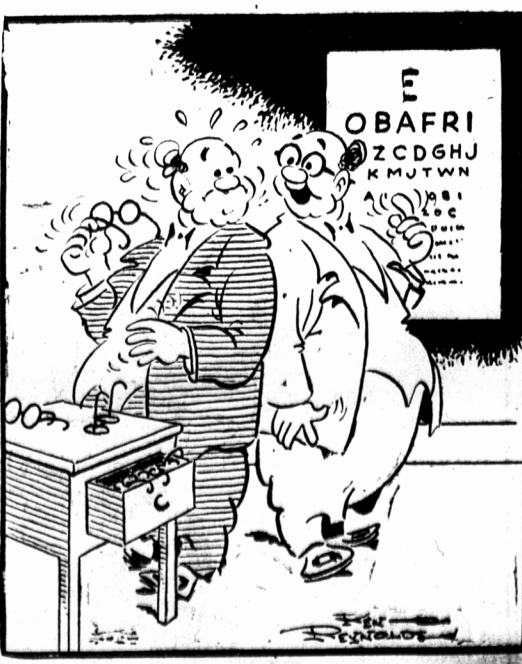
