

Shearwater Flyers Beat Fort William Redskins

HALIFAX (CP) — Shearwater Flyers, both on amble that produced two fourth quarter touchdowns, wore down the West's Fort William Redskins 27-16 Saturday afternoon in the Canadian intermediate football championship.

The 4,000 fans who watched in blazing sunbath mobbed the new stadium after the game and tore down goal posts. The win clinched a 10-year buildup in Maritime football to the second year of affiliation in Canadian Rugby Union ranks for the Fort William Redskins.

The Flyers, who represent the

naval station at nearby Eskdale Passage, led 15-4 at the half but trailed 21-14 going into the final 15 minutes.

Shearwater's terrible three of Bob Hayes, Bruce Walker and Buck Taylor scored all of the team's four touchdowns, haliback Hayes picking up two. For the Redskins, which won Major League hockey with Ray Melo, backs Brian Hadash and Larry Downey were the major to push his club ahead 21-14.

BEHIND 21-14

The Flyers could only manage a rousing rally that, ending the third quarter behind 21-14.

Shearwater's superb conditioning showed in the dramatic fourth quarter.

The Flyers who best Brantford Tiger-Cats last week for the Eastern title in the final quarter, gambled for as much as 10 yards on third downs.

It was third down play that put Hayes over with the first 10 yards in the quarter. They led with less than five minutes left. Walker bulked through five Redskins on a third down, three-yard goal line plunge that ended the scoring and the game.

The Flyers had a 24-12 edge on first downs and outdistanced Fort William 330-305 along the ground. They completed eight of 15 passes for 37 yards while the Redskins completed five of 12 for 71 yards.

Works Program Quite Possible

OTTAWA (CP) — A general program of federal public works across Canada to reduce unemployment is "quite possible," says Minister Howard Green and Thursday in the Commons.

He blamed the former Liberal administration for not having "a nice big program of works on the shelf which could have been pulled out in 1956."

Maurice Bourget (L. — Lewis) who has asked about the chances for such a program, said that as former parliamentary assistant for public works he is sure Mr. Green could find such plans if he looked "on other shelves."

"I've looked on all the shelves and under all the beds out in Green replied. "We're going to do everything that can possibly be done in view of what was done by previous governments."

The exchange was one of several which occurred during the question period as other members suggested ways of providing more employment.

J. W. Pickett (C. — Bonaventure) said the government should "get out" with a new office at Westville, N.B., planned by the former Liberal government, and other projects started.

High Water Level Makes Trapping A Bit Difficult

The trapping season is in full swing and trappers are experiencing some difficulty with an exceptionally high water level. Both muskrat and mink are plentiful in most sections. Muskrats are running small and down in fur quality according to some trappers. I had that opinion myself although I haven't examined many. About half that I viewed from Montreal indicate that muskrat and wild mink prices will be about the same as last season — and the prices received last year were the lowest for many years.

Local buyers who paid one dollar and a dollar and a quarter for muskrats took a bad beating. Some such lots only realized 90c on the Montreal fur market and expenses had to be added out of that. Lots of choice wild mink for which local fur buyers paid \$14.00 each fetched \$2.25. In conversation with local fur buyers, who have been at the game for many years, I was told that 75 cents was the top offered for muskrats and running down the scale to 25c for kits. One buyer noted that \$8.00 would be the price offered for the best mink in the country. Beaver and Otter are in good demand but this will not greatly affect local trappers as other are practically non-existent. Mink and muskrat are the staple furs

CANBERRA, Australia (Reuters) — An Australian scientist suggested Thursday that a Christian country should turn the other cheek if Russia bombed it with nuclear weapons.

Nothing could justify one power using nuclear weapons against another, Professor Marcus Oliphant said.

Oliphant, director of the research school of physical sciences at the Australian National University, was speaking at a lecture here.

If the United States hit back by bombing Moscow and other Russian cities, the Russians would bomb more of the U.S., he said. This would go on until both countries were destroyed completely.

He said the present world situation can be resolved only by thinking in terms of morality and that the problem of war and peace cannot be solved by arms or economics.
