### Union Road Farmers Own Leading Junior Ayrshire

Roadale Ciceily, owned by Andrew B. and Fred T. MacRae, Union Road Queens Co., was the leading Canadian junior two-year old in the 365-day division R.O.P. last month, it has been announced by headquarters of the Ayrshire Breeders Association of Canada.

The young heifer produced 9,620 lbs. of milk 415 lbs fat for an average test of 4.21 percent. This is 146 percent of the breed average for that class in for milk and 147 percent for butter fat. She is classified "Good Plus" as a first calver.

Incidentally the report from Ayrshire headquarters indicates that last month marked the last time that production will be computed in the 365-day division. In future the ROP Division will compute records for 205 days with a space to include total production for the lactation for cows that milk longer than 205 days.

Big Vote In Polish Elections  
 WARSAW (Reuters) - A surprisingly-heavy poll in regional elections Sunday has given the Communist leadership of Poland an encouraging boost in their struggle against political apathy and economic troubles.  
 Unofficial voting figures released Monday indicate many more voters cast ballots than the 70 per cent forecast in Communist party circles. The original predictions were based on apparent lack of interest in the elections among citizens of Poland's main cities and towns.  
 The trade union newspaper Glos Pracy commented that the heavy poll was a rebuff to "hostile right-wing circles."  
 "This mass poll testifies to the fact that people have confidence in the political line of the party and in the changes that start in October" - October, 1956, when Poland's leaders defied Russia to set out on their "own road to socialism."  
 But other sources said some voters may have turned out either from habit or because their names were on the voter's lists and they felt it was wise to show enthusiasm.
