King Hussein Announces Crisis In Jordan Is Over

AMMAN, Jordan (AP) — King Hussein said Tuesday "the crisis in Jordan is ended."

The 21-year-old monarch, apparently feeling in firm control after three weeks of touch-and-go tension which threatened the peace of the whole Middle East, rejected a Russian complaint that the United States is interfering in Jordanian affairs.

Says Strikers Are Threatened

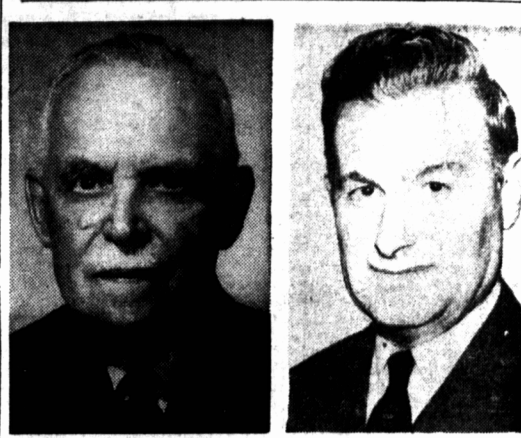
