Output Of Factories Falls

OTTAWA (CP) — Shipments from Canadian factories, which earlier this year had been above last year's levels, decline slightly during August. The bureau of statistics said today August shipments by manufacturers were an estimated \$1,790,343,000, down 1.6 per cent from \$1,809,761,000 in July and the same percentage decline from \$1,810,041,000 in August 1956. Total shipments for the first eight months were \$14,329,785,000.

Gunmen Rob Ontario Bank

ST. GEORGE, Ont. (AP)—Two masked gunmen Monday held up a branch of the Bank of Montreal in this community six miles north of Brantford, beat two persons and escaped with \$3,836. The pair, who may have been assisted by a third man in getaway car, escaped two outlets and shook off a pursuer before abandoning the car. Victor Broughton, accountant in charge of the sub-branch, was struck with a pistol and M. Fermaniak, 59, was knocked to the sidewalk when he attempted to enter the bank while the bandits were leaving.

Zhukov Says U.S.S.R. Getting New Missiles

BELGRADE (AP) — Russian Defence Minister Georgi Zhukov claimed Tuesday the Soviet Union has made strides to equip its forces with the most modern weapons, including intercontinental missiles. This was the first indication by a Soviet authority that the intercontinental missile might be part of the actual equipment of the Soviet army. The Russians have announced that they fired an experimental intercontinental missile. Zhukov made the statement in response to a toast in his honor at a luncheon marking his arrival here for a Yugoslav tour. Zhukov said: "Forty years of socialist economic and cultural development in our country, the fast development of our science and technology, have made it possible for us to equip our armed forces with the newest first class arms, including atomic and hydrogen weapons, the most complicated radio location devices and jet and rocket techniques, in the framework of which are also intercontinental ballistic missiles. In accordance with the development of the newest arms we have also perfected the organizational structure of our units, bringing them into full harmony with contemporary needs." The launching represents the most important contribution to the world of science, and in fact is a link in a chain of the most important achievements of the Soviet people.

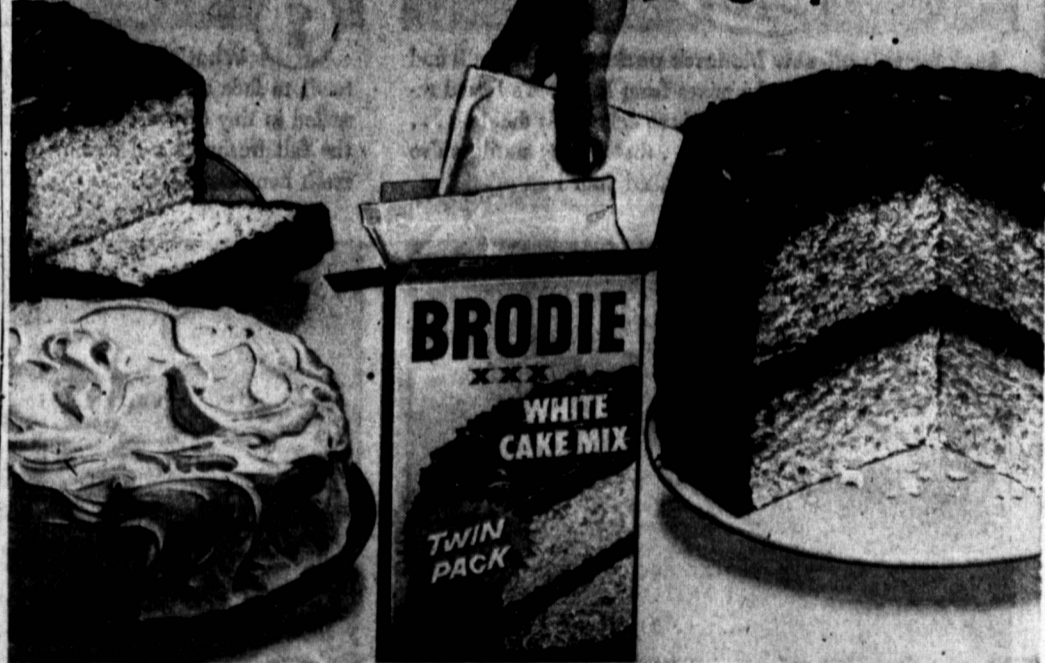


FEATHER BUNS

Combine 1/2 c. water, 3 tbs. granulated sugar, 1 tsp. salt and 1/4 c. shortening; heat, stirring constantly, until sugar and salt are dissolved and shortening melted; cool to lukewarm. Meantime, measure into a large bowl 1/2 c. lukewarm water; crumble and add 1 cake Best Yeast—or stir in 1 tsp. granulated sugar and sprinkle with 1 envelope Best Dry Yeast. Punch down dough; cut out rounded spoonfuls of dough with a table-spoon; drop into greased muffin pans, filling each pan about half-full. Grease tops. Cover and let rise until doubled in bulk. Bake in a hot oven, 425°, about 20 minutes. Yield—20 medium-sized buns.
