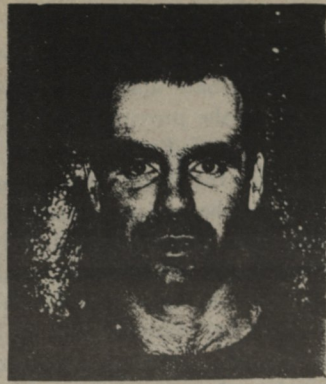


# Celebrity Corner
