**ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP)**—The cattle herd at the Flying L ranch on Newfoundland's Burin Peninsula has been taken over by the Toronto-Dominion Bank. A letter from branch manager John Ballard read Monday night at the annual meeting of the Newfoundland Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals said the bank had taken steps to guard against starvation of the herd.  
 Mr. Ballard refused Tuesday to elaborate on the letter or say what authority the bank had to take over the ranch.  
 He said the ranch had been established with money borrowed from the bank and the latest count indicated about 1,000 cattle on the ranch.  
 Some residents contend that as many as 900 head of cattle from a herd of 1,800 may have starved to death on the peninsula.
