## Anti-Tuberculosis Project For Summerside

As recently announced in these columns by the Director of Tuberculosis Control, an x-ray and vaccination project would shortly be undertaken for the people of Summerside. It is now announced that this programme will start on the 16th of March.

It is planned to first cover the Summerside High School beginning on that date, at the school, and then the convent, starting the following Monday at the new Health Centre.

The first essential phase is a chest x-ray of all people. This will be followed by a tuberculin test, which in the case of the school children is subject to parents' consent. The school children will therefore be taking home, next week, consent slips which will require the signature of parent or guardian permitting the tuberculin

testing of the child. The result of this tuberculin test is then read 48 hours later. When this reading shows no reaction to the tuberculin test and the chest x-ray also shows negative, it is recommended by medical authorities that such person accept a BCG vaccination at a later date.

From the 25th of March to about mid-April the clinic will be open at the Health Centre at convenient hours, to be published, for the adult population. Tuberculosis is not restricted to any age group and is indeed very prevalent in the middle age bracket. BCG vaccination provides a considerable degree of immunity to TB. Therefore all the adult citizens of Summerside are exhorted to take advantage of this precautionary measure and attend the clinic. It is but a matter of few minutes for each visit. Whether or not a BCG vaccination is found desirable, a chest x-ray should be considered a must for everyone.

This project is wholeheartedly endorsed by the Summerside physicians.
