## Bonny Sails For Belfast

**HALIFAX (CP)**—The aircraft carrier Bonaventure sailed Wednesday for Belfast, Northern Ireland, to be used as a transport for officers and men plus squadrons of Banteng jet fighter planes and other aircraft.

The destroyer escort Ottawa accompanied the carrier. They are due in Belfast Nov. 1.

The ship is under direction of Vancouver senior Canadian naval officer aboard, assisted by the commanding officer of the ship, Lt. Col. Harold V. Groos of Victoria.

Two ships will carry out anti-submarine exercises in Northern Ireland waters until Nov. 10, after which they'll be joined by six destroyers from the 1st and 3rd Canadian Squadrons.

The anti-submarine carrying more than 2,500 men will sail for Canada conducting manoeuvres on the way under direction of Cmdr. Brock. They are due back in Halifax Nov. 27.

The ship from the 1st and 3rd squadrons have been visiting Northern European ports including Stockholm, Copenhagen, Hamburg, Kiel and Oslo.

## Crew, Captain Involved In Row On Ship

**SANDWICH, Mass. (AP)**—The Liberian freighter Aroa was reported by the U.S. Coast Guard to be proceeding calmly Wednesday night after a row between the 25-man crew and the captain that delayed the ship several hours.

No one was injured, the coast guard said. Officials said an argument between Capt. Germaine Perreault and second mate Eleftherios Metzanos over a faulty rudder led to the fiasco.

A fist fight between the two broke out, they added. The captain was overpowered by the Greek-speaking crew, they said, when he attacked the second mate with a knife and fire axe. **POLICE RUSH TO SHIP**

The first of three messages from the ship said: "Captain and crew berserk, tried to kill mate with knife and fire axe. Signed Rademan."

The second reported the captain in his cabin and "more or less" calm.

The third, identified as coming from the captain, said, "Impossible to continue voyage with same crew. Vessel's safety in danger. Request my immediate replacement upon arrival."

The messages sent police rushing to meet the ship as she entered Cape Cod canal.

Police Chief William Foster said that after three hours of conciliation efforts officers were agreed to patch up their differences and sail the ship to New Jersey.

## Canada Leads In Wheat Exports

**OTTAWA (CP)**—Canada led the world in wheat exports in August though the amount shipped was slightly below that of last year.

This was the first time in four years that Canada has topped the United States in wheat exports in the opening month of the new crop year.

Canadian shipments totalled 27,200,000 bushels, down from the 29,200,000 shipped in August last year but higher than the 16-year average of 20,400,000, the bureau of statistics reported today.

## IN MEMORIAM

**WALTER J. TROWSDALE**  
The news of the sudden death on the morning of September 25th, 1957, of Walter J. Trowsdale, aged 38 years, Craigmiles, came as a distinct shock not only to his immediate family but to a wide circle of friends and associates.

Most of Mr. Trowsdale's life was spent in Iqaluit engaged in farming the old homestead of his late parents, Mr. and Mrs. Sidley Trowsdale. Because of a chronic heart condition he was obliged to leave the farm about ten years ago and moved to Craigmiles where he was employed as Mail Courier on the Bradburn Craigmiles route. Just the day previous to his untimely passing he made his round of duty as usual, but during the evening he was stricken with heart failure from which he failed to rally.

Thirty eight years ago Mr. Trowsdale married his first wife Myrtle Folland of Granville and to this union was born nine children, three of them predeceased him in infancy.

The funeral service was conducted by Rev. C. Kharman assisted by Rev. W. B. Ebbary, Mr. Charman in his many friends. A message of comfort to the bereaved family. ## Consumer Credit Bill Increases

**OTTAWA (CP)**—Canada's consumer credit bill rose to a new high of \$2,470,000,000 June 30, the Bank of Canada reported Wednesday.

This was a gain of \$103,000,000 from the \$2,367,000,000 owing on March 31 and was just \$5,000,000 below the record \$2,475,000,000, reached last Dec. 31.

However, the March-June rise of \$103,000,000 was smaller than the \$167,000,000 increase in the similar period last year.

The amount outstanding June 30 was \$157,000,000 higher than the \$2,315,000,000 owing in June a year ago.

All segments of the on-cuff trade showed increases. Amounts owing June 30 with March 31 figures: Total, \$103,000,000; consumer credit, \$103,000,000; retail, \$103,000,000; finance and loan companies, \$818,000,000; 721,000,000; personal cash loans, \$811,000,000 (\$86,000,000).

## Turks Vote On Sunday

**ISTANBUL (Reuters)**—Turkish political leaders would up their campaign for the vote on Sunday's general election.

A law forbids rallies during the three days before the vote. Observers expect the Democratic Party, headed by President Celal Bayar, to be returned with a reduced majority.

Foreign policy has not been an issue in the campaign and the dispute with Syria has scarcely been mentioned.

The Democratic party headed by President Bayar and Premier Adnan Menderes, has stood on its platform of economic development.

The Republicans attack the government for raising the cost of living; for shortages of coffee, the country's most popular beverage; and for making into an over-abundant industrialization program.

The new assembly will have 612 members, one for each 40,000 people according to the 1955 census.
