

Cheevers Will Play Tonight



ROCHESTER, N.Y. (AP)—Goalie Jerry Cheevers, who injured his right knee in Rochester's final American Hockey League game Sunday night, was discharged from St. Mary's hospital Tuesday. His chances of playing here against Quebec Aces Wednesday night in the Calder Cup semi-final playoffs are good, club officials said. Cheevers was forced out of action with one minute and 53 seconds left in the Sunday game. He said he injured his knee when he attempted to kick out a Baltimore shot with his right foot. Until his exit, Cheevers hadn't missed a minute of play this

season, which saw the Americans win the Western Division championship with 48 victories and 21 losses. Quebec won 44 games and lost 22 in capturing the Eastern Division title.

DETROIT (CP)—Detroit Olympia, home of the new National Hockey League champions, could use a squad of traffic cops to direct hordes of hockey players using the arena to prepare for the Stanley Cup series. Toronto Maple Leafs, who wound up the regular season here Sunday by beating the Red Wings 4-0, are staying on to practise for their B series semi-final against Montreal Canadiens.

Winners of the two series meet in the best-of-seven final for the Stanley Cup, the post-season prize that has come to mean more in prestige and money than the Prince of Wales Trophy that Detroit clinched last week by finishing on top of the six-team heap after a 70-game schedule.

Chicago Black Hawks moved in Tuesday for workouts before opening the A series against the Wings here Thursday night. With the place so crowded, the host club plans just one practice on Olympia ice today and then will shift camp to Toledo to rest for the encounter with the Hawks.

True to form, Leafs manager-coach Punch Imlach had his squad working for 90 minutes the day after Toronto took the Vezina Trophy away from Red Wing rookie Roger Crozier and delivered it to goalies Terry Sawchuk and John Lower. Crozier held a two-goal lead over the Toronto goalies in the Vezina race going into Sunday's game but the 4-0 Leafs win snatched away the top goal-keeping prize.

PRACTICES SCHEDULED

Imlach has scheduled practices for today and Wednesday before taking the team to Montreal to meet the Canadiens Thursday night. The club is being kept incommunicado in suburban Dearborn.

Centre Bob Pulford, injured in practice last week, is skating again and is reported ready for the playoffs.

Detroit coach Sid Abel, who scorns the Imlachian dogma of work and more work, plans only a light workout before heading for the Toledo rest camp, the usual Red Wing routine at play-off time.

A club spokesman said Monday the Wings were disappointed at the fact Crozier lost the Vezina and the \$1,000 that goes with it.

"They were sorry they went out on a loser after winning 15 straight games at home, but they're fit and confident of taking the Stanley Cup," he said. Defenceman Doug Barkley is off the injured list and ready to go.

Petroleum Co. Says Net Loss Less in 1964

CALGARY (CP)—Net operating loss for 1964 of \$176,524 was reported Tuesday by French Petroleum Company of Canada Ltd. in its annual report.

The figure compared with a 1963 operating loss of \$1,272,577. Income in 1964 from the sale of crude oil, condensate and natural gas amounted to \$2,064,022, an increase of \$51,586 from 1963.

Proven oil reserves of the company totalled 24,309,501 barrels as of Dec. 31, 1964, after production during the year of 999,736 barrels. Proven developed gas reserves as of Dec. 31, 1964, were 89,650,000,000 cubic feet.

The Glasse royal commission estimated \$400,000,000 a year could be saved by eliminating waste and inefficiency in Canadian government operations.

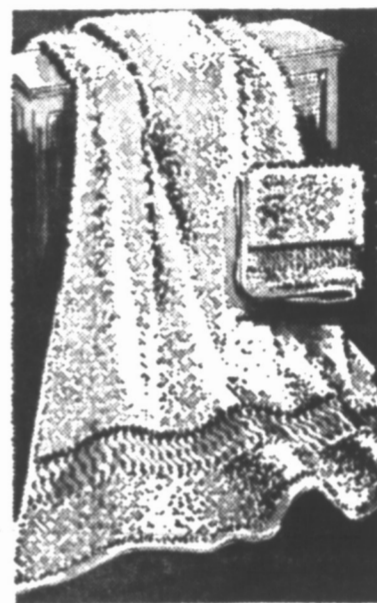

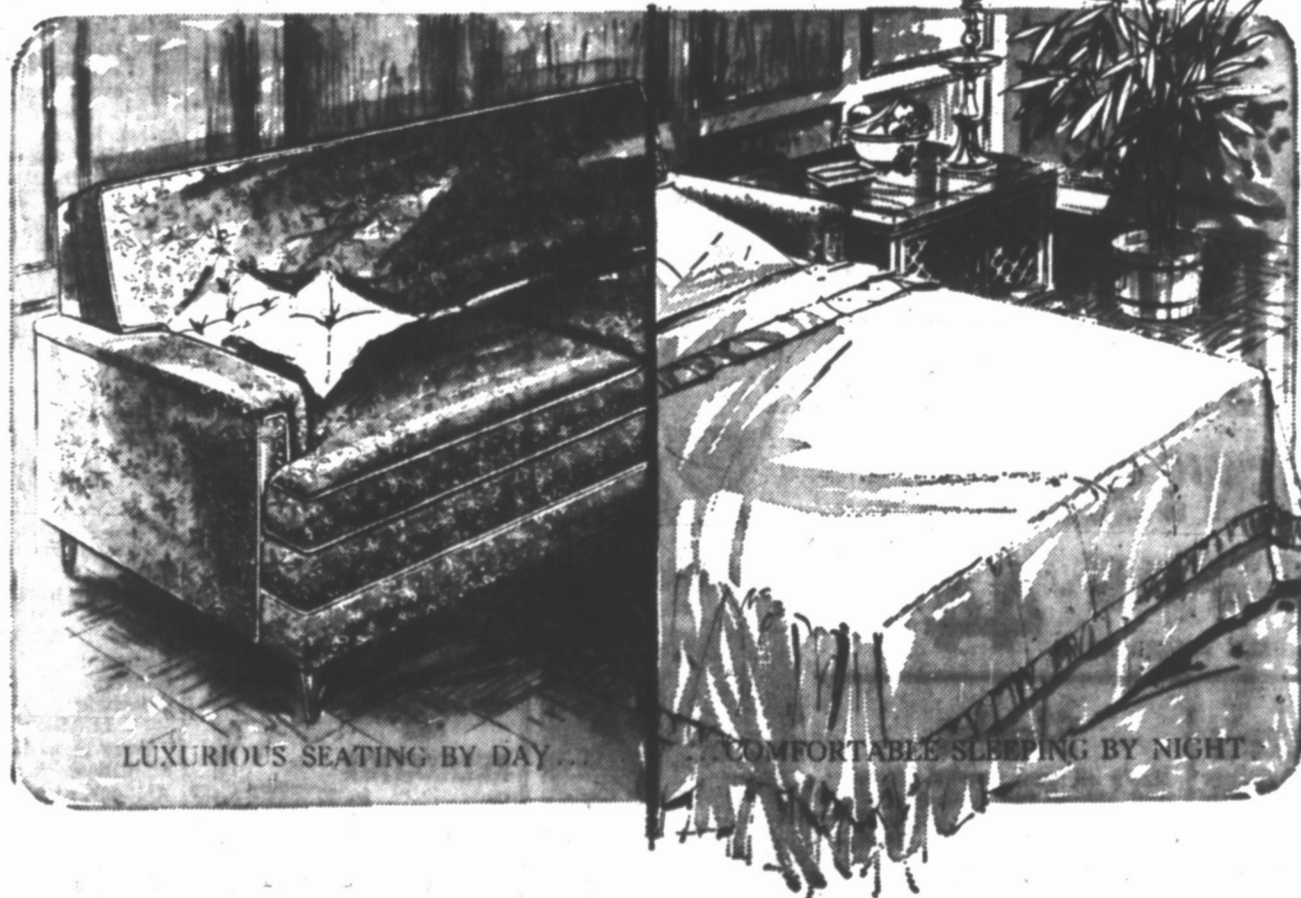
