

**Funds Needed  
For UIC Pot**

OTTAWA (CP)—The Unemployment Insurance Commission will be in difficulty to make benefit payments to too less claimants by the end of this week, unless parliamentary approval is given soon for a government loan, Labor Minister MacEachen said here.

He told the Commons he hopes the supplementary estimate covering loans to the unemployment insurance fund for the new fiscal year starting at midnight Tuesday will be approved soon.

He said, in reply to Stanley Knowles, NDP—Winnipeg 2 North Centre, present reserves in the fund are not adequate to meet benefit demands beyond a short time.

Opposition Leader Diefenbaker asked whether it is correct the fund will not be in danger during the next 10 days.

Mr. MacEachen said unless the loan dealing with the fund is approved this week, the commission would be trouble by the end of next week.

Mr. and Mrs. Harry McConnell and family of Charlottetown, motored to Georgetown last week where they visited with friends and relatives.

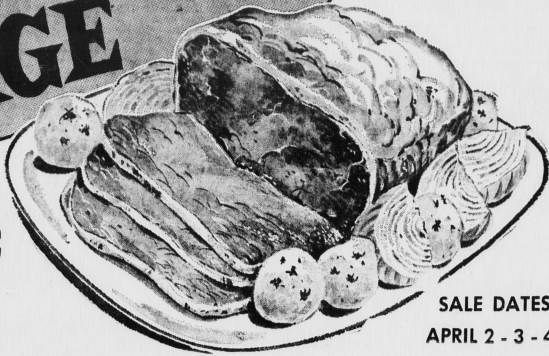
