## Ireland Votes On April 7

DUBLIN (Reuters) — Ireland will vote April 7 in a general election brought on by the defeat of a government candidate in a crucial by-election last week in County Cork.  
 Premier Sean Lemass, who succeeded President Eamon de Valera as head of the government in 1959 and has ruled with the support of a handful of independents in the Dail (Lower House) for the last three years, made the announcement.  
 He said Parliament will be dissolved next Thursday.

## Joey To Ignore Premiers' Talks

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (CP) — Premier Smallwood said here he has not attended a Canadian premier's conference since 1963 and "I do not intend to ever attend another one." He did not give a reason.  
 He told the Newfoundland legislature, until last year, there were 10 premiers at the conference but now only nine are attending. He said this would not affect his decision as to whether he would attend future federal - provincial conferences.  
 When asked later if he would give a reason for his statement, he said "no."

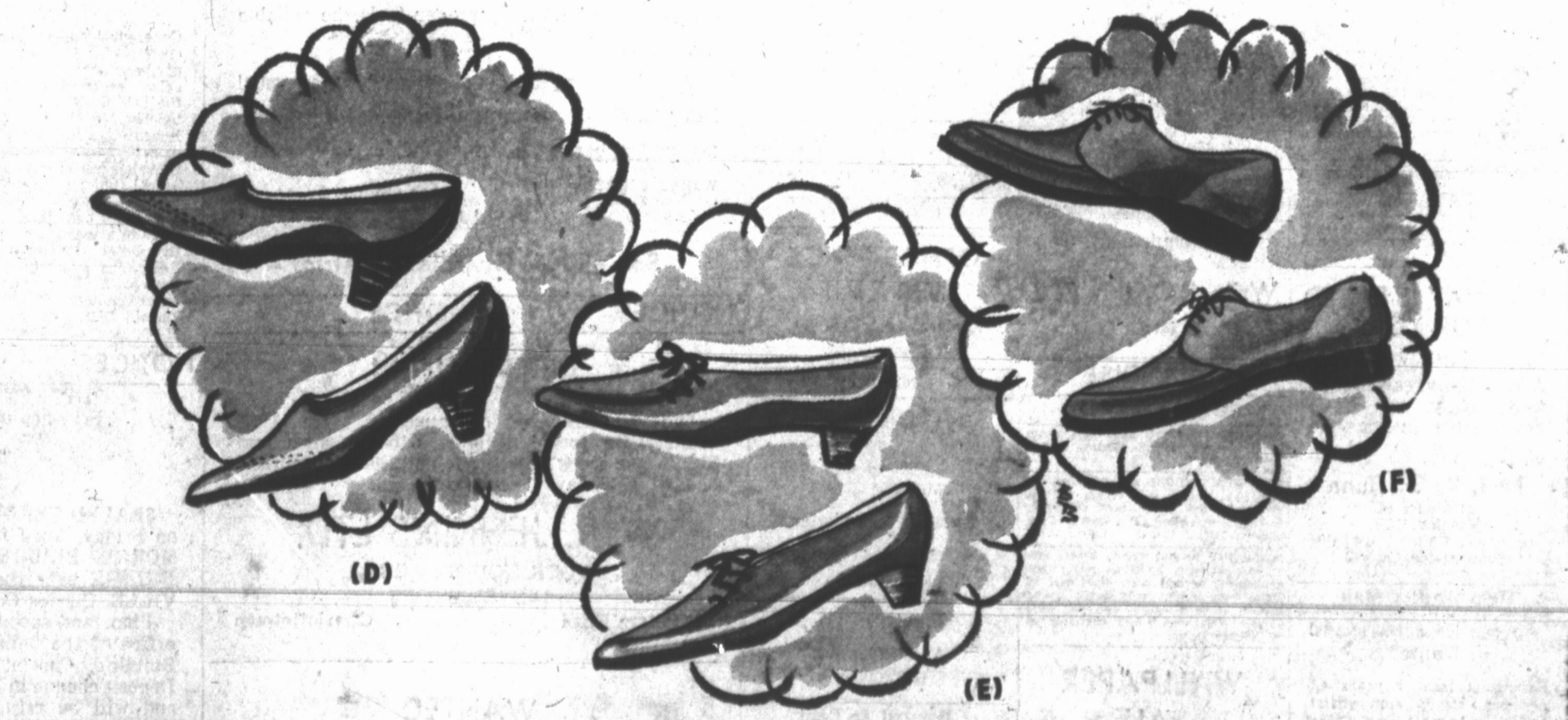
