Fire Chiefs Convention Continues At Summerside

Deputy Fire Marshal Earle Sturgeon of Fredericton, N. B., was the opening speaker yesterday afternoon of the three day session of the Maritime Fire Chiefs Convention held in Summerside.

Mr. Sturgeon in his address, "Fire Prevention Education" reviewed for the assembled chiefs in a most graphic manner the chief causes of tragedies in the home by fire, with particular emphasis laid on the negligence of parents who carelessly go away from their homes at night or day leaving their children at home, alone and unprotected.

Fire Marshal Sturgeon said that "any man or woman who leaves children at home at night is a criminal", and he presented a motion that a committee be appointed to look into the question of amendments to the criminal code regarding the parents who leave their children alone and unprotected in this manner.

During the morning sessions, the fire marshals of the three provinces addressed the convention on matters in connection with their departments. Chief Justice Thane A. Campbell was the guest speaker last evening. Chief Justice Campbell chose as his subject a review of the highlights of the history of Prince Edward Island from 1534 when Jacques Cartier first landed in the province, down through the years under the French and English regimes up to the present day.

Mayor Henry Wedge presided and in his introductory remarks expressed his great pleasure in having had the large number of fire chiefs and their ladies visit Summerside on this memorable occasion. Mayor Wedge extended a sincere invitation to all to again visit Summerside and said that they would always be assured of the same hearty welcome and kindly
