Free Swimming Stages Of The Lobster

(G. F. M. Smith in "Progress Reports", Atlantic Biological Station)

Lobster eggs, after having been carried outside the body of the female for almost eleven months, usually hatch in July. The young, recently hatched lobsters are about one-third of an inch long.

The other day a young fellow said to me: "It's funny, when a man works for a farmer he gets a dollar a day and gives a reasonable day's work; but when he gets a job on the road he gets twice as much pay and does half as much work!"

During the daylight hours, the free swimming larval lobsters rise to the surface of the water. By the use of specially constructed fine mesh sieves, they have been found in most of them are the upper few inches of the water.

SUMMARY

The current trading session uncovered a series of price declines on practically all classes of live stock at most Ontario markets.

U. S. Market Unchanged

Cable advices from the United Kingdom indicate unchanged prices although English markets were tending easier.

Calves Steady to Stronger

Calves were generally steady at Toronto with choice at \$8 to \$8.50 and a few \$9.75.

Eastern Cattle Prices

All grades of cattle except fed calves shared in the decline at Toronto. Steers and heifers were down 15 cents and cows and bulls 25 cents.

Western Cattle Prices Easier

Most transactions at Winnipeg this week favored the buying end of the trade. Heavier receipts, warm weather and an easier trend in American markets combined to cause a general decline.
