

GENERAL NEWS.

Military preparations at Woolwich for Egypt have been completed. The Bedouins are threatening to become a source of trouble in Egypt. Fenian emissaries are said to be actively engaged against the English in Egypt. A Montevideo telegram says the Uruguayan troops have dispersed the insurgents. The British troops in India are enthusiastic over the proposed military expedition to Egypt. The value of the coinage minted in the United States during the past year was \$117,541,000. The revenue of the United States Government for the past fiscal year amounted to \$403,000,000. A Liverpool shopkeeper advertises that he is able to sell cheaper than his married competitors, who have to support a wife and children. The increasing popularity of lager beer in England has stimulated the British brewers to undertake it. But they do not make it yet with glucose.

Lady Hobart, who has taken a deep interest in Canadian immigration, has arrived at Quebec, and will visit some of the many whom she has sent out in previous years. Among the resident foreigners the rate was 43.76 per 1,000. Both rates are very high. The last census showed the whole population to be 212,034, of whom 164,718 were Egyptians and 47,316 foreigners.

In the collegiate schools of Germany the study of Greek is to be retarded for one year, for the purpose of giving more room to French and physical science. Great stress is laid on the proper acquisition of the French language. The understanding of it when spoken is to be specially acquired by dictation. The President of Chili is making active efforts to bring about the restoration of peace, and with this end in view is removing from office the strong partisans of extreme measures and replacing them by those who support his peace policy. A bill has been introduced in the Chilean Congress declaring all territory to be Chilean up to Cameron's valley.

The senior soldier in the German army is Emperor William, who is its head. In March he entered in his 80th year. The youngest soldier in the same army is the son of Duke Paul Frederick of Mecklenburg-Schwerin, who is scarcely yet a month old, and who has just been enrolled by the veteran Emperor, in the Seventeenth Regiment of Mecklenburg Dragoons.

The most contradictory reports circulate with regard to the crowning of the Emperor of Prussia, and it appears certain that Count Ignatieff is straining every nerve to induce the Emperor and Empress to alter the decision of the Imperial family council, and celebrate the coronation this year, the Count offering with his life to guarantee that no attempt of the Nihilists will take place.

When the Duke of Sutherland was on this continent last year, he was so enraptured with the flavor of the indigenous black bass that he decided on trying to naturalize that fish in Scotland. Accordingly he made arrangements with Mr. G. S. Page, President of the American Piscatorial Association, to have a batch of black bass taken over to Sutherlandshire. The consequence is there is a good prospect of that delicious fish soon being at home in Scottish waters.

The Russian police have succeeded in gaining possession of the roll and other documents of the more active branch of the Nihilists who have been collecting and supporting the revolutionary organs and the more sanguinary members of the party with funds. The names of all the Nihilists who have so far paid the penalty with their lives appear on the documents, which contain nearly seven hundred names, including those of persons of high rank and all the Executive.

One of the most eminent of German medical men is reported as saying that there are not more, probably, than 10,000 persons in Germany, who have become slaves to the habit of hypodermically injecting morphine. There are many who take as much as eighteen injections every day. Some have hardly a square inch of skin on their bodies which is not marked by scars produced by this practice. Slaves of this habit are even more hopelessly enchained than those who take opium in other ways, and it is speedier destruction.

A truly Oriental tragedy is announced from Persia. Mirza Hussein Khan, who was for many years the favourite Minister of the Shah, and who accompanied him on his famous journey to England, gave offence to his master recently. The cause of the offence was the Shah's discovery of the fact that his servant had grown inconveniently rich. The Minister was dismissed from office, and was compelled to disgorge a large portion of his wealth. He left and established himself in a fortress in a distant portion of the country. The Shah did not send an army against the ex-Minister; he sent him a cook. Mirza Hussein soon died from the effects of a cup of coffee. Possibly the Porte may yet solve the Egyptian difficulty by furnishing an Arabi with an efficient cook.

The Globe's London correspondent's letter contains a forecast of the harvest prospects in England, which he admits will need a fine July and August to verify. Fruit will be dear, and apples scarce, therefore he urges an increased exportation of Canadian snow apples and russets. The latter, he says, keep perfectly under any weather conditions. His letter points to the possibility of a dissolution of Parliament at the end of the present session, and even hints at the formation of a Coalition Ministry, composed of moderate Liberals and less illiberal Conservatives such as Earl Carnarvon. It also gives a summary of the high honors taken by the female students of Girton and Newnham Colleges at the recent Tripos examinations at Cambridge University.
