Fish and Water.
Strange as it seems, a fish may suffer death by drowning. When a stream is suddenly swollen with water that has fallen upon and drained from surrounding soil which has been exposed for some time previously to the sun's rays, the water is warmed and deprived of its power of holding a proper complement of oxygen. The vivifying gas in consequence escapes, and the fish, deprived of the aids necessary for respiration, faint and die, as they would if placed in tepid water.

A fish, like a man, requires a perpetual supply of oxygen to his breathing apparatus. A fish gets its oxygen from the water, a man from the atmosphere around him. Reverse the position of the two, and the fish becomes what is called drowned in the open air, while man is drowned in the water. A fish taken out of water dies from drowning, because the little blood containing filaments which comprise the gills become stuck together and of course cannot act so as to oxygenate the blood.

In the degenerate days of the third Napoleon, and in the childhood of the third republic, Maitre Locheud was the idol of the French bar.
