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High Salaries To Be Raised Last

OTTAWA (CP) - Revenue Minister Benson said the job reclassifications now being done in the civil service include the singling out of certain positions in which salaries are considered to be higher than the general level.

These "red-circled" jobs were those in which salary increases would be delayed until others caught up.

Mr. Benson rejected a suggestion by New Democrat Leader Douglas that some salaries had been reduced before there was an opportunity for collective bargaining. He said no reductions are being made.

Mr. Douglas asked whether the minister had received a telegram from Vancouver protesting salary reductions of \$1,533 a year for about 90 customs and excise officers.

The minister said he had no knowledge of such a telegram.
