MONTREAL (CP) - Industrials bounced back from Monday's decline on the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Tuesday.

Base metals, papers, carriers and refining oils advanced. The construction issues were mainly unchanged.

The food industry group was hit by profit-taking and losses of a point were seen in Ogilvie, et al and Sherriff at 37.

The beverages also declined with Canadian Breweries off 1/4 at 36 1/2. The Ontario Supreme Court ordered the company to stand trial under the Combines Investigation Act.

Fairbanks was a feature of the day, up 4 at 31, a new high, as the company announced an increased quarterly dividend.

The steels were mixed with Standard Structural off 1/4 at 10 and Stelco up 1/4 at 74.

Active issues included Massey, unchanged at 12 1/2 and Crain up 1/4 at 15 1/4.

The mines and oils were mixed. The closing averages show the banks up 0.4 at 69.98, utilities up 2.2 at 152.2, industrials up 1.2 at 311.5, combined up 9 at 258.4, papers up 3.4 at 477.5 and golds up 63 at 87.29.

TORONTO (CP) - Industrials swept aside the profit-taking that has dogged them the last four sessions as they led the stock market up Tuesday in moderate trading.

Industrials gained almost three points on index, their best since Jan. 15. Base metals and western oils each added one point but golds slipped off almost one-half.

The final volume was 3,209,000 shares as trading picked up considerably at the close. Tuesday's volume was 3,221,000.

Senior base metals were strong. International Nickel gained 1 1/2 at 19 1/2 and Hudson Bay was up 1/4 at 62 1/2.

Gold and silver were mixed. Gold advanced 1/2 at 18 1/2, and Home B. ahead 1/4 at 18 1/2.

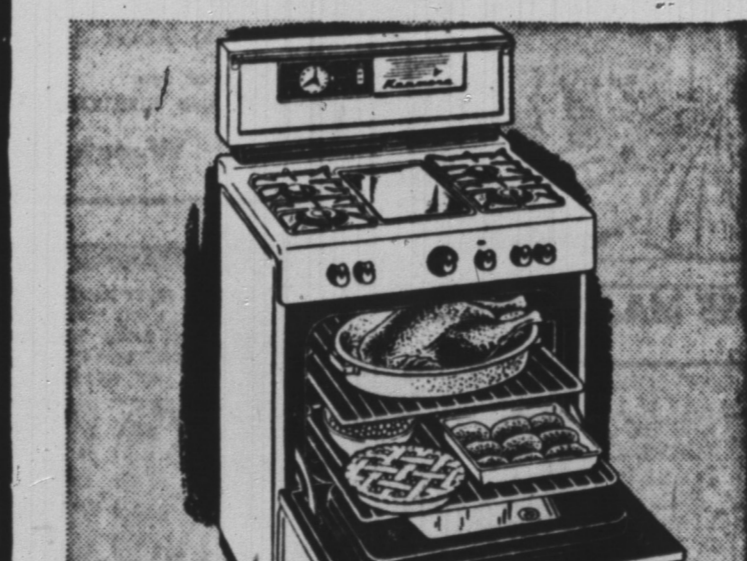
