BOOK REVIEW.

The Public School Grammar by H. J. Strang, B. A., Principal Goderich Collegiate Institute, price 25 cents. Toronto, Canada Publishing Company, Ltd. This is one of the best public school grammars I have had the pleasure of examining. It is authorized for use in the public schools of Ontario by the Minister of Education. The main subject kept in view by the author in preparing this work is to make the study of grammar promote as directly and efficiently as possible the art of speaking and writing the English language correctly. The explanations are brief but clear. A definite mode of treating each part of the subject is given, and it is left with the teacher to furnish such further explanations and illustrations as may be necessary. Only a few formal definitions are given, the author realizing that it is much more important that pupils should be trained to recognise and distinguish the different classes and uses of words, etc., than that they should be able to repeat formal definitions of the terms employed. This excellent little work is divided into four parts, viz Part I—The sentence and its parts; Part II—The parts of speech, classification and inflection; Part III—syntax and analysis; Part IV sounds and letters, punctuation, capitals and correspondence.

II. The High School English Grammar (revised edition) by John Seath, B. A., Inspector of High Schools for Ontario. Price 75 cents, Toronto: The Canada Publishing Co. Ltd. This work has been constructed in accordance with the view that, while English grammar is a science with important practical applications, it is, when properly studied, an intellectual discipline of the highest order. This work is on an historical basis, the author claiming that only on this basis can the structure of the language be intelligently explained. "Old English," says Prof. Skeat, "is the right key to the understanding of modern English, and those who will not use the key, will never open the book with all their fumbling. This book is a very valuable book of reference for teachers.
