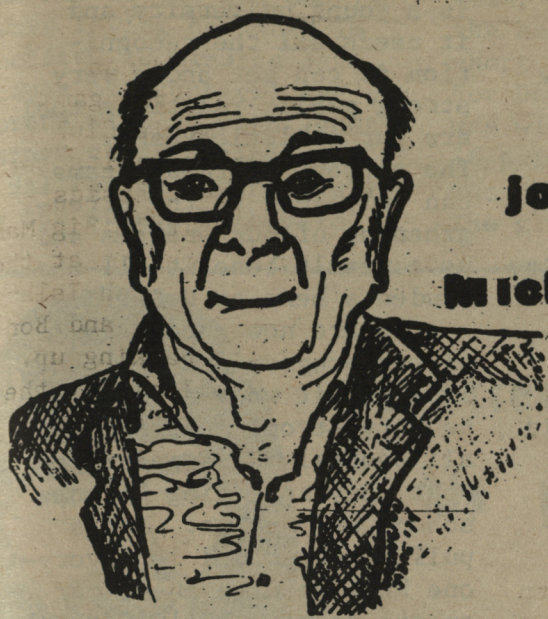


# Despite Good Play, Panthers Lose All Games on Weekend

First to clear up a personal matter. We thought it would be a good gesture if the Student Union arranged to have a bus transport students to the Forum for Sunday's hockey game. President Woozy assented to our suggestion and so we, on Tuesday, made out all the forms which would complete the formalities that go along with chartering a bus. We were advised on Wednesday that the bus would be at Marion parking lot to shuttle students to the Forum during the hours of noon to 1.00 P.M. on Sunday. The bus just did not show up and, when we phoned the person responsible he advised that he did not know to whom he had passed along the instructions and could give no reason for failure. He is sorry..but that does not make our students any happier. Naturally they blame the Student Union. As we drove homeward, in sorry state, after the game we recognized a group of girls, mournfully trudging their way back to the campus, and gave them a lift. As soon as they got into our vehicle they told us about what they would do if they got hold of the miscreant villain who had misinformed them about the bus trip... they were somewhat mollified when we told them that we were the guilty party but we wonder how the rest of the student body feels. We assure them we are sorry, but it is just that some unidentified third party is the guilty one.... what student union will do for future games is a question.

As far as the hockey game itself is concerned we must admit it was a good exhibition of the game. We

are pleased that such a large crowd..(at least 2000 crowded into the Forum) was on hand to cheer their favourites on but we must concede that, on the play on the Forum ice this day, the better team won. In the first period SMU hit early with Kenny MacLeod denting the twine at the 2.02 mark while Larry Arsenault was serving a penalty, and Dean Hartwell scoring a peculiar goal, after beating goalie, Snags McInnis to a loose puck, at 3.58. SMU dominated play throughout the period but we struggled back to a tie after Dave Murnaghan scored on an angle shot at the 10.58 mark and Daniel Lessard tied it up at 18.26. In this period they outshot us 17-8 In the second period SMU quickly took the lead they maintained when Dave Nowlan scored a quick one at the 0.47 mark and Bob Dugan made it 4-2 shortly thereafter. Doug Chase made it 5-2 for them at 18.00 and Terry Devine closed the gap to 5-3 just before the second period ended. In the third, Dave Nowlan, whom we would estimate to be the fastest man on the ice, scored his second for SMU and Wilfred MacDonald closed out the scoring when he notched up one for our side late in the third to make it 6-4 for SMU. We were outshot by a wide margin, SMU having a 17-21-8 total for 46 S.O.G.s and UPEI 8-5-7- for a 20 total. We do not think a fan in the rink would disagree with us when we say that Snags McInnis was our outstanding player. Although we don't want to fault our defence we thought SMU forwards played so well and managed to elude our best efforts at net protection that we'd ask CIMN to play an old song "All alone, I'm so All Alone" several times this week and dedicate it to

Snags.

In conversation with the SMU broadcast crew we were told that the race for playoff spot this year will be intense. They (as usual) say their own team will finish first but thought the next three places would be very close. We believe we will be right in there, one loss to SMU does not a season make. Next weekend the team is off for games at Dalhousie and Acadia. Next home game will be at the Forum on Sunday the 7th with UNB. We have seen both Acadia and Dalhousie and are optimistic about our chances with them.

On Friday night in Antigonish our Basketball Panthers got off to a good start, in league play, when they outscored old rival St. F.X. by an 80-71 score after leading 35-32 at the half. Top scorer for us good guys was Tom Hibbert with 23. Art Laffin was close behind with 20 and Bronx Feighery and Tom Kappos chipped in with 14 and 12 respectively. We did not have a good game on Saturday

at Dalhousie and succumbed 104-87. After 5 minutes play we were trailing 12-25 and had to fight uphill thereafter. Late in the game, high scorer Art Laffin (25 points) was injured, when we had closed the gap to 6 points and had to leave the game. We lost our momentum and fell behind to lose by 17. Kevin Feighry had 14 points while Tom Hibbert had 20 and Tom Kappos had 17 with 15 rebounds.

Gary Heald and this year's edition of the Basketball Panthers have raised interest in this sport to a height it has never attained in U.P.E.I. history. Next games will be with U.N.B... this Friday at 8:00 and with Moncton Sunday afternoon at 4:00 pm..if you want a seat you had better be there early as we are told gym capacity is limited to about 300.

On their trip the Lady Panthers Basketball team played a good game at St. F.X. but were outscored 65-50 after trailing 35-32 at the half. Sheri Sterns(UPEI history students will recognize
