OTTAWA (CP)—Justice Minister Chevrier has said the Government has no intention of studying the use of bilingual warrants for arrest.

He was replying to Gilles Ouellet (SC—Lapointe), who referred to the case of Richard Thibault of Hull, Que., who has refused to accept a parking ticket for months because it is written in English only.

Mr. Thibault got a ticket for illegal parking on Parliament St.

Mr. Chevrier said the RCMP had acted in this case as agent for the city police of Ottawa, which was under Ontario jurisdiction, where English was the only official language.

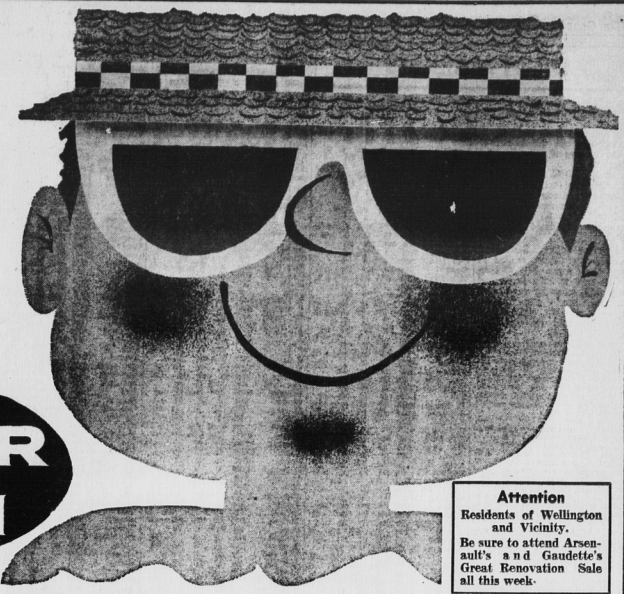
