Halifax Packers Charge Workers Are Inefficient

HALIFAX (CP)—A prominent fish packer and exporter says the average Halifax fish plant worker doesn't give a day's work for a day's pay, is inefficient and generally takes no pride in his job.

In contrast, added President D. M. MacKenzie of Halifax Fisheries Limited, the Lunenburg worker was steeped and schooled in the traditions of fish packing. He took pride in "a good job well done."

And so Lunenburg fish plant employees got more money than did those in Halifax. Halifax plants would be willing to pay more if they could get more efficient workers, he told the royal commission on price spreads Thursday. But efficient workers just didn't seem to be available.

MORE ADVANCED
"You mean that there are some people like that in Halifax?" asked commission chairman Dr. Andrew Stewart of Edmonton.

"I am sorry to say there are," replied Mr. MacKenzie, vice-president of the Atlantic Salt Fish Exporters Association.

Commission member Cleve Kidd of Toronto, president of the Ontario Labor Federation, suggested that perhaps productivity was greater at Lunenburg because of a more advanced technology there.

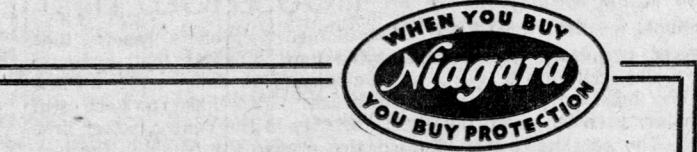
