# Orin Idle But Still Tops

Despite the fact that Parkdale Flyers have played no games since the last statistics were released last week both the Flyers and their flashy centreman Orin Carver are still tops in the Island Hockey League.

The Flyers are well entrenched at the top of the league with a .750 average on 9 wins in 12 starts and Carver's point total of 44 keeps him well in front in the race for scoring honors.

Apps Arsenault, second place in the scoring, could gain only one point on idle Orin and lags behind Carver to the tune of 13 points. Arsenault has 14 goals and 17 assts.

Carver's 25 goals is still high but a determined bid to overtake him is coming from a Basilio Youth Club winger, Merrill Pineau, who has scored 9 goals and 1 assist in the last three B. Y. C. games to trail Carver by only 5 goals with a

total of 20.

Pineau is the first player not wearing a Montague or Parkdale uniform to break into the top five scorers since the season's early days. Pineau has 29 points good for a tie with Billy Hughes of Montague for fourth place, behind Montague's Dick Carroll in third, with 30 on 11 goals and 19 assists.

Allie and Skip Carver of Parkdale and Montague coach Bubby Dowling are all tied for sixth with 28 points.

Parkdale's acrobatic goaltender Frank Roper is top netminder in the loop with 4 goals - against average of 4.55 and the Parkdale total average of 4.83 on 58 goals in 12 games is the league's best.

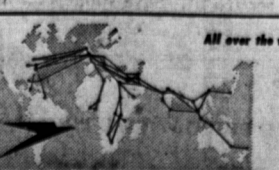

## Serene Football Meeting Erupts Into Fast Action

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—The seemingly tranquil meeting of the powerful football rules committee of the National Collegiate Athletic Association erupted into action Tuesday and took strides to outlaw protective face mask grabbing "before the practice becomes dangerous."

E. E. (Ted) Wieman, former head coach at Princeton and Michigan and now athletic director at the University of Denver, said the 25-man group reached tentative agreement on barring the practice and placing it in the personal foul category.

"The use of the protective face mask is becoming quite general," Wieman said after the closed meeting, "and the practice of players grabbing opponents by the masks is also becoming all too common."

Should the move be approved by the committee's 11 voting members at today's final session, the practice will be outlawed and a 15-yard penalty imposed for a personal foul against the player guilty of mask-grabbing.
