

U.S. Department Source Indicates The Components

WASHINGTON (CP)—A U.S. defense department source indicated recently that a Canadian air-ordnance contract that Defence Secretary Robert McNamara said Monday would be cancelled is for rocket components. The name of the Canadian manufacturer was not revealed.

The cancellation is part of a review of the \$1,000,000,000 in U.S. defence department contracts for air ordnance announced by McNamara at a press conference Monday. He said the department plans to audit any excessive building of inventory, while maintaining adequate production for the Viet Nam conflict.

The source, which cannot be named, said the production contract referred to by McNamara was a "simple error" in using the word "bomb."

Ottawa (CP)—U.S. Defence Secretary Robert McNamara was "obviously in error" when he referred to a cancellation of a Canadian contract for bomb production, a spokesman for Industry Minister Drury has said.

The spokesman said since there is no such contract, McNamara was incorrect in his reference to it at a Monday press conference.

"It is difficult for us to say what Mr. McNamara might have been referring to in his statement," the spokesman said.

There have been reports the reference was to U.S. attempts to buy surplus bombs originally purchased for Canadian forces. These reports say Canada refused to ship the bombs directly to Viet Nam because it is a member of the International Trade Commission.

Mr. Drury's spokesman said he couldn't confirm the reports but certainly Mr. McNamara was not referring to any existing contract.

Federal Welfare Minister Outlines The New Concept

Ottawa (CP)—The man who refuses to work still has a right to public support under the new concept of public assistance in Canada, Welfare Minister MacEachen said.

He said the right is specifically set out in the Canada Assistance Plan passed by the Commons last week.

The man and his family must demonstrate only their need for financial help, Mr. MacEachen told a Senate committee examining the plan.

His deputy welfare minister, Joseph Willard, said welfare workers have come to realize "psychological blockages" of long background have sapped some persons of any motivation to work. Some families have lived on welfare for generations.

The purpose of "work-activity projects" envisaged by the plan is to restore work habits and motivation, he said. The projects probably would prepare men and women for vocational and technical training, starting with matters as basic as grooming habits and how to approach employers for a job.

But even if a man refused to enter such a project, he deserved—as a right—assistance according to need.

FEW FRELOAD

Mr. Willard said the federal government believes the number of persons freeloadng on social assistance is small, perhaps infinitesimal. Several senators agreed that the freeloaders have better fortune with social insurance—particularly unemployment insurance.

The committee took just 75 minutes to question the health minister and report the bill back to the Senate, where it is expected to be passed this week.

The plan authorizes a 50-per-cent federal contribution to provincially-run welfare programs. The provinces are free to merge assistance to the elderly, the blind, the disabled, and to mothers, into a single system.

The \$75-a-month ceiling is removed by the legislation with a pledge substituted, obliging the provinces to provide for food, shelter, clothing, fuel, utilities, household supplies and personal requirements.

Beyond these basic requirements, provinces may assist with costs of travel, funerals, health care and special care in institutional homes.

Senator David A. Croft (L.-Ontario) said the "great weakness" of the plan is its discrimination against the have-not provinces.

What good is flexibility if the province hasn't got the money to match your federal grants?" he asked.

Mr. MacEachen said the problem of equalization confronts every provincially administered scheme. In this case, the federal government decided to wait for the federal-provincial tax structure committee to come up with a general program of equalization.

RIDDING QUIZ

Partner bids One Diamond, next player passes, neither side vulnerable. What would you bid with each of the following four hands?

1. ♠Q72 ♥KQJ6 ♦5 ♣KQ754
2. ♠A16 ♥KJ2 ♦Q95 ♣AQ74
3. ♠J9543 ♥8 ♦K3 ♣AKJ82
4. ♠AK74 ♥AK52 ♦— ♣QJ843

1. Two clubs. This follows the usual policy of bidding the longer suit first. The intention is to bid two hearts over the expected two diamond rebid by partner. In this way the hearts, having been bid secondarily, become identified as a four-card suit. At the same time the clubs become marked as being at least five cards long.

If the first response were one heart, and the clubs were then named over any rebid by the opener, it would be next to impossible for partner to guess that the longer suit was clubs.

2. Three notrump. This is far and away the most enlightening bid possible. The direct response of three notrump denotes a hand containing 16 or 17 high-card points, strength in the unbid suits, and notrump distribution (usually 4-3-3-3).

Diplomats Attempt Planting

WASHINGTON (AP)—Two Czechoslovak diplomats tried to plant a listening device in the U.S. state department, U.S. officials said Wednesday, but failed because the American FBI was really working for the FBI.

The story was related by state department officials in the presence of Frank John Mrkva, a Korean War veteran, who was credited with having thwarted the plot. The device, described as an effective, self-contained unit that can pick up every-

thing said in a room, was also displayed.

One of the two Czech envoys involved, Jiri Opatrny, an attaché, was immediately declared persona non grata and asked to leave the United States. The other, Zdenek Pisk, is a first secretary at the Czechoslovak United Nations mission in New York.

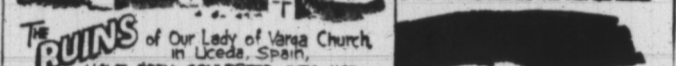
UN sources indicated Pisk would not be expelled from the United States.
