Coun. Wright Seeking Fourth Term On Council

City Councillor Arthur Wright, who has served three terms on the council, will again be a candidate in the forthcoming civic election, Feb. 12. He will run in Ward Three. Although no definite word has been received from other councillors whose seats at the council board become vacant next month, it is reliably reported that Mrs. Dorothy Corrigan and Arthur Gormley are planning to re-offer. They represent Wards 2 and 1, respectively. The only other ward in which an election is to be held is the city's newest, Ward 6, represented for the past two terms by Elmer MacRae and Edmud A. Arsenault. No word of their intention has been received. No election will be held this year for the office of Mayor, nor for council seats in Wards 4 and 5. A change in the Act of Incorporation, passed by the Provincial Legislature, made it possible for the Mayor and Councillors of those wards to remain in office one extra year. Formerly, all Council seats became vacant every two years, and it was to remove the possibility of an entirely new Council taking office, especially during Centennial Year that the change was requested.
