

TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

LONDON, June 5. In the Commons, this afternoon, Sir Charles Dilke stated that Arabi Bey had ordered work on the earthworks stopped.

This evening in the Commons the first clause of the repression bill passed in committee by a vote of 237 to 39.

ROME, June 4. All the Liberal journals appear in mourning and publish eulogies of General Garibaldi.

TRIESTE, June 5. The Italian organ, Independent, having appeared with a black border, because of the death of Garibaldi, has been confiscated by the authorities.

ROME, June 5. Movements are being made in many cities for the erection of monuments to Garibaldi.

Cairo, June 5. In consequence of the protest of the British Government against the military preparations in Egypt, the Sultan has telegraphed to the Khedive to request Arabi Pasha to discontinue them.

Campaign Notes. The Montreal correspondent of the Toronto Mail interviewed a Bank President a few days ago relative to the financial condition of the country.

Q. Have you read the article in the Herald on banking and commerce? A. Yes, I have glanced over it.

Q. Do you see any cause for alarm in the public mind in the figures as given therein from the Government banking returns? A. At the first glance they are startling, when we see such an expansion of commercial discounts as sixty millions in two years and twenty millions loaned on stocks and the like, which is also a great increase over two years ago.

At the present moment nothing seems less likely than a general Grit victory in the contest going on. The indications are that the National Policy will triumph in every Province of the Dominion.

Mr. Blake is at his old game of setting Ontario against the Maritime Provinces. The cry in the West now is that Ontario is being oppressed by the Maritime Provinces!

The Toronto "Telegram," which inclines to Mr. Blake, says Mr. Blake's address to his constituents is not as satisfactory to commercial Reformers as it might be.
