New Soviet Jet Plane Is Reported

WICHITA, Kan. (AP)—Pilots of a world-circling business jet airplane said recently a Soviet-built Sukhoi "fishbed" jet fighter plane flew alongside their craft as it cruised between Japan and the Aleutian Islands Wednesday.

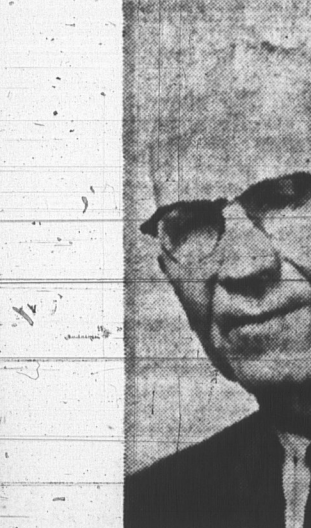

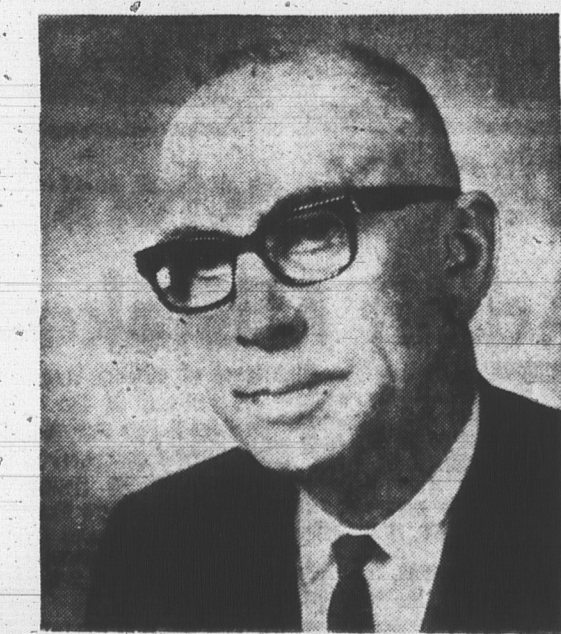

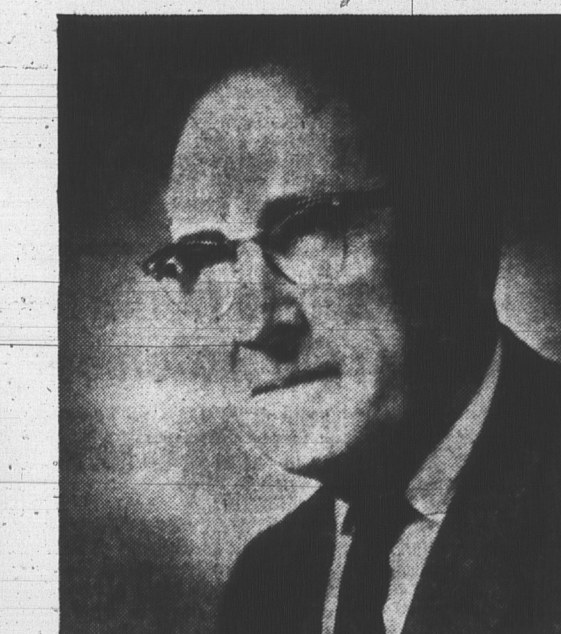
