

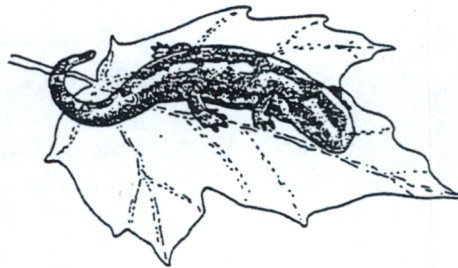
Eastern (Rufous-sided) Towhee - 1 in northeastern P.E.I. on Oct. 3 (VL), 1 at East Point area on Oct. 11 (DO); **American Tree Sparrow** - 1 at Crossroads feeder on Nov. 3 (DO), 9 at China Point on Nov. 7 (DO), 1 at Tryon feeder on Nov. 9 (R&BH); **Clay-colored Sparrow** - in northeastern P.E.I. on Oct. 3 (VL); **Savannah Sparrow** - numerous at Earnscliffe on Oct. 13 (DCS, DO, EMa), several at Greenwich Dunes Trail on Oct. 21 (JDM, RPh); **Nelson's Sharp-tailed Sparrow** - 1 at East Lake on Sept. 25 (DO); **Fox Sparrow** - 1 at Earnscliffe on Oct. 13 (EMa, DO, DCS) **Song Sparrow** - several at North Lake on Sept. 25 (DO), huge numbers at Earnscliffe on Oct. 13 (EMa, DO, DCS), 6 in grain fields and hedges at Argyle Shore on Oct. 16 (JDM), 2 at China Point on Nov. 7 (DO); **Swamp Sparrow** - 5 at East Lake on Sept. 25 (DO), 1 at Earnscliffe on Oct. 13 (EMa, DO, DCS), 1 at Greenwich Dunes Trail on Oct. 21 (JDM, RPh); **White-throated Sparrow** - several at North Lake on Sept. 25 (DO), 1 at Earnscliffe on Oct. 13 (EMa, DO, DCS); **White-crowned Sparrow** - 1 at East Lake on Sept. 25 (DO); **Dark-eyed Junco** - scattered reports in October along roadsides; **Snow Bunting** - approx. 50 in Hampton potato fields at Hampton on Oct. 18 (JDM), 1 at Lakeside on Nov. 3 (JBl, BMcO, Blanch), 1 at East Point on Nov. 4 (DO), 1 at Earnscliff on Nov. 7 (DO), 500+ at Middleton grainfield on Nov. 9 (JDM, LY); **Red-winged Blackbird** - 500 to 700 in standing corn at Spring Valley on Oct. 7 & 8 (JDM, WFB, LY), 100 at Argyle Shore on Oct. 7 & 16 (JDM, LY); **Rusty Blackbird** - 7 at Dingwell's Mills on Nov. 3 (JBl, BMcO, Blanch); **Common Grackle** - 11 in standing corn at Spring Valley on Oct. 8 (WFB, LY); **Purple Finch** - large numbers at East Point on Oct. 11 (DO); **Common Redpoll** - none reported in this period; **Pine Siskin** - large numbers at East Point on Oct. 11 (DO); **American Goldfinch** - approx. 50 flying over fields at Traveller's Rest on Nov. 9 (JDM); **Evening Grosbeak** - none reported in this period.
