VALUE: UP TO \$7,500.

The National Institute on Mental Retardation is offering awards to students registered in graduate studies at a Canadian university and planning a career in mental retardation. The Type A award offers one year of financial support, ranging up to \$7,500. plus a period of orientation training provided by the National Institute on Mental Retardation. Awards are not renewable but candidates may apply for a second year of support.

The awards are made possible through the support of the Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation of Canada.

FIELD OF STUDY: Tenable in a broad range of fields relating to mental retardation and particularly biomedical, psychosocial and educational areas.

DURATION: Academic year 1981-82.

CONDITIONS: Accepted into a full-time graduate program at a Canadian university. Canadian citizen of landed immigrant. Candidate must state intent to pursue future career in Canada.

DEADLINE: Applications to be received by February 15, 1981. Announcement of awards to be made by March 31, 1981.

VALUE: UP TO \$6,000.

The National Institute on Mental Retardation is offering research supplements to students enrolled in a graduate program at a Canadian university and planning a career in the field of mental retardation. The Type B award offers up to \$2,000. per year to students who have financial support for a particular area of enquiry and require supplemental funds to offset the costs of research. Awards are not renewable, but candidates are eligible for up to three consecutive years of support. In addition, the award offers the opportunity for attendance at a period of orientation training provided by the National Institute on Mental Retardation.

The awards are made possible through the support of the Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation of Canada.

FIELD OF STUDY, DURATION, CONDITIONS same as TYPE A.
