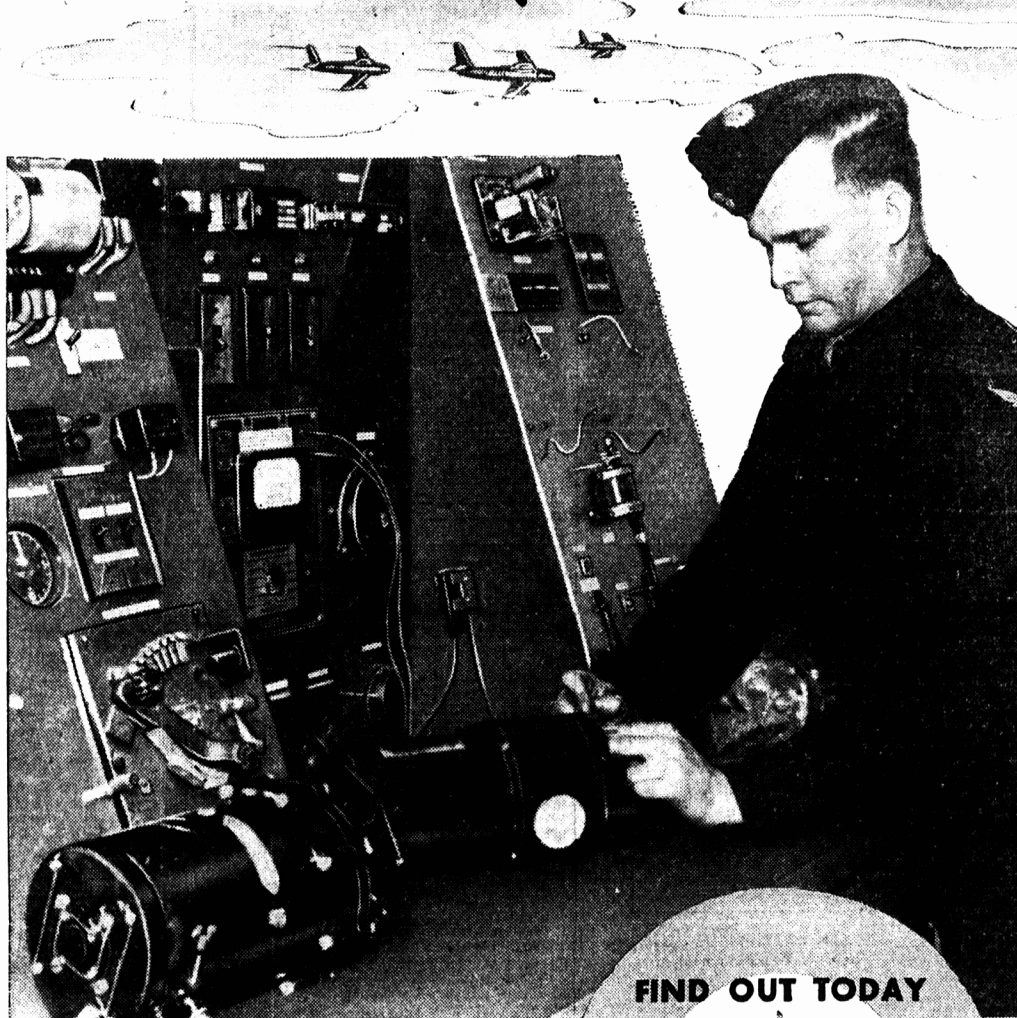
The winners of this series will later meet the Prince County winners in a series for the Island title and Physical Fitness trophy.

# Mark-Ye-Well Wins Handicap

ARCADIA, Calif., (CP)—Calumet Farm's Mark-Ye-Well, a lopsided favorite, gave the form bettors a scare Saturday before rallying to win the \$100,000 Santa Anita Handicap by a nose.

The four-year-old Kentucky colt cut thinner at the finish than was expected, and it took a last surge to hold off a belated rush to the wire by Mrs. Lea Warner's Trust-

ing. Alfred Vanderbilt's First Glance pace-setter until the turn into the stretch, was third, four lengths back of Trusting.

Time for the 1 1/4-mile race was 2:01 1/5.

The 59,000 fans who turned out for the 16th running of the race expected to see Mark-Ye-Well win in a walk. The favorite went to the post at 3-to-5 odds—shortest price on a single horse in the history of the race.

Mark-Ye-Well paid \$3.50, \$2.70 and \$2.40. Trusting paid \$3.60 and 2.70 and First Glance \$3.70.
