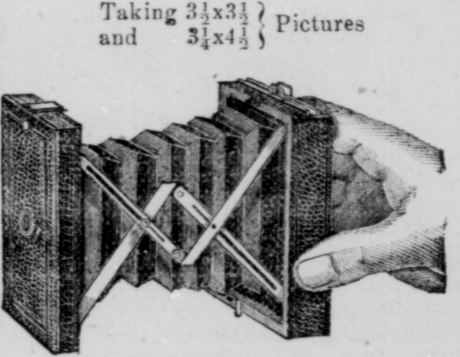
**Some Remarkable Bulls.**

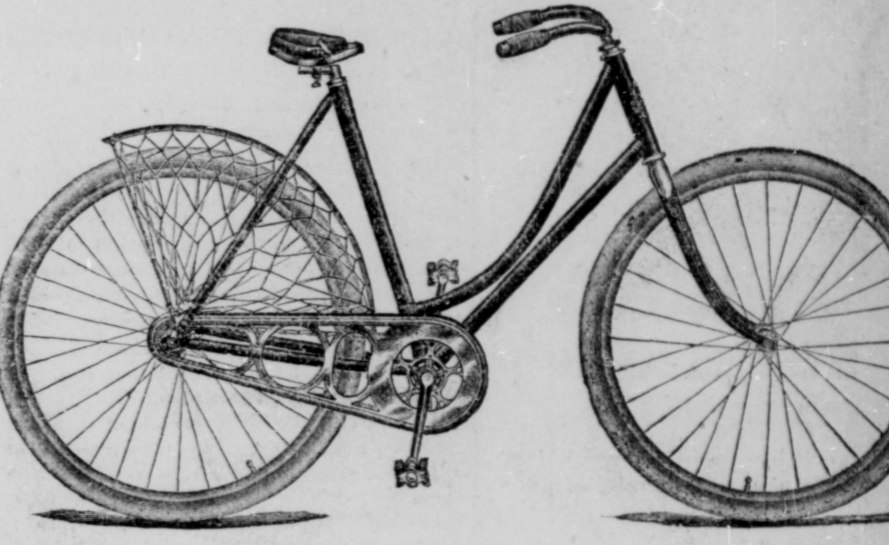
