Possible Labor Draft Forecast; To Recall Reserves

LONDON, Jan. 29 — (CP) — Prime Minister Attlee today outlined to the House of Commons a £4,700,000,000 British rearmament program as "an integral part of North Atlantic defence" against Communist aggression. It embraces the calling up of more than 250,000 fighting reserves — most of them for a two-week training period — increased arms production and a possible labor draft. Expenditures would cover a three-year period.
