A By-Law Respecting Milk Vendors.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the City of Charlottetown as follows:—

- Every person publicly selling Milk in this City in or from any vehicle shall obtain from the Mayor thereof a License as a Milk Vendor and the Mayor is hereby authorized to issue such license upon receiving the License fee hereinafter mentioned.
- The License fee for the present year 1897 and up to the Thirtieth day of April next shall be Fifteen dollars and shall be payable on the Twentieth day of August next and thereafter the said License fee shall be fifteen dollars per annum and shall be payable on the First day of May in each year.
- The City Collector for the time being shall be and is hereby appointed Inspector of all Milk offered for sale in this City.
- It shall and may be lawful for the said Inspector to examine and inspect all milk so offered for sale wherever the same may be offered.
- It shall be the duty of every person keeping or offering Milk for sale whether on the streets or in shops or private dwellings to furnish to and permit the said Inspector to take samples thereof for examination or analysis, and any person hindering the said Inspector in the discharge of his duty, or refusing to permit him to examine and inspect or to take samples of such Milk, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against and incur the penalties of this By-Law.
- It shall be the duty of the said Inspector whenever he has reason to believe any milk to be adulterated with water or any other substance to procure a sample thereof to be analysed and to prosecute all persons who may be found selling, offering or keeping for sale any adulterated Milk.
- No person shall expose for sale or sell anywhere in this City milk adulterated with water or with any deleterious substance.
- No person shall expose for sale or publicly sell Milk in this City in or from any vehicle without having first obtained a License therefor in manner above mentioned.
- Any person or persons guilty of any infraction of any of the provisions of this By-Law shall upon conviction in the City Court of the Stipendiary Magistrate on the oath or affirmation of any credible witness forfeit and pay at the discretion of the said Magistrate a penalty not exceeding the sum of Thirty dollars for each offence exclusive of costs and in default of payment thereof it shall and may be lawful for the said Magistrate to commit the offender or offenders to the Common Jail of the County of Queens County for any period not exceeding Thirty days unless the said penalty and costs be sooner paid, provided always that nothing in this By-Law shall be construed to require persons selling milk in stores or from their private dwellings to take out the License above mentioned.
