



Resolve to oust Pres from Senate chair

the university Senate is going to ask for a change in the University Act, so that in future, President Peter Meincke will not act as chairman of Senate.

Don't get excited, though. This is not a rebellion.

In fact, the move was largely Meincke's idea.

The chair position has been occupied by the University's President since UPEI came into existence.

But now, the consensus of Senate is that there should be a separation of administration, represented by Meincke and academic policy-making.

Meincke agreed that being chair "puts the President in a very difficult position" and that it would "be better to have a tough-minded parliamentarian with no other relationship to Senators."

He added that the motion would put the President in a stronger position to make a case for or against a particular motion.

This raised some questions as to the effect knowing the President supports a proposal will have on Senators' willingness to speak openly.

However, Education professor Gerald Arsenault

could see no problem with inhibitions.

"I don't see what difference it makes. If the President doesn't like what we say, that's too bad."

He said the President's non-chair role will be "strengthening of his position as an academic leader" and called it "a step forward."

The method of choosing a new chair was not decided, but Senator Glenn Palmer suggested the "person" be "nasty, efficient, and shouldn't mind making enemies."

Canada Mortgage and Housing — Deadline March 16th.

George & Nora Elwin Scholarships — Deadline March 31st

University Women's Club of Saint John, N.B. — Deadline March 31st

The following scholarships are awarded to students entering their first year of the course leading to the Bachelor of Laws degree at the University of New Brunswick.

Tore Martin Grude Memorial Scholarships in Law — Deadline March 31st

Available to both male and female students entering their first year of Law at UNB. Award will be the amount of

tuition fees payable.

Qualifications: Academic ability; Participation in community and extra-curricular activities; Financial need.

Lord Beaverbrook Scholarships in Law — Deadline March 31st

Available to both male and female students entering their first year of Law at UNB. Award will be \$4,500/year.

Qualifications: Declared desire to study law; Qualities needed for the attainment of distinction in the legal profession.

Application forms for these two are available at the Registrar's office.
