

# U.K. Labor Rejects Gov't Call For Wage Restraint

BLACKPOOL, England (Reuters)—The giant Trades Union Congress representing 8,300,000 British workers, Thursday rejected the Conservative government's call for wage restraint. The rejection is almost certain to lead to a new round of industrial say claims.

The 1,000 delegates approved a resolution declaring that the unions are not prepared to accept a policy which would cut the workers' living standards. The resolution charged that the government has shirked the responsibilities of stimulating production and dealing effectively with the problem of prices and profits.

## NOT BLUFFING

\*Frank Cousins, head of the 1,000,000 - strong Transport and General Workers Union said "we are not calling anybody's bluff. We are not bluffing either."

Cousins, in moving the resolution, said the unions are ready to go through every step of negotiation and, if proper, arbitration. Cousins said that prices have risen in many cases because of direct government action — high interest charges removal of food subsidies, increased social security charges and a recent act which allows landlords to increase rents.

## SHARP DEBATE

A sharp debate flared up over the Labor party's new policy of achieving control of industry

by the government purchase of shares in big private concerns. Bryan Roberts, National Union of Public Employees, moved a resolution asking the congress to note that it has not yet been possible for the TUC general council to carry out the mandates of earlier congresses pledging nationalization of industry.
