



**Sentenced To Penitentiary**

Previously convicted on a charge of theft, Joseph Peter Gallant, 22, Charlottetown, was sentenced to two years in Dorchester Penitentiary by Magistrate K.M. Martin in City Police Court yesterday morning.

The case arose out of the theft of a number of dressed turkeys and hams from the Co-op Super Market on Queen Street on December 23rd. An accomplice of the accused also of Charlottetown, convicted on a similar charge was sentenced to three months in the Queen's County Jail, he being a first offender under the Criminal Code of Canada.

Also on yesterday's Police Court docket a charge of drunk and incapable against a local man was withdrawn by the prosecution. A new charge, that of stealing a quantity of cosmetics the property of Mrs. Lloyd Ford, was laid in its stead. The accused entered a plea of guilty and was remanded until Wednesday for sentence.

A drunk and disorderly was given a twenty day suspended sentence. Of two drunk and incapable, one was fined ten dollars and costs or five days and the other was remanded until January 13.

Charged with drunken driving, an accused entered a plea of guilty to driving whilst his abilities were impaired by alcohol, and the

magistrate imposed a fine of one hundred dollars and costs or twenty days.

**Swiss Pilot Saved More Mountaineers Than Anybody**

SION, Switzerland (AP)—Herzog-Geiger has become a Swiss national hero by risking his life as daily routine in an exclusive and hazardous calling of his own creation.

As an Alpine glacier pilot, the stocky, dark-haired Swiss probably has snatched more mountaineers from death at high altitudes than any other man alive.

He has landed more than 15,000 times on stamp-size snowfields high in the Alps, pitting his skill and courage against tricky mountain gales that threaten to dash his small plane on the rocks.

One of his biggest rescues was in 1954, when he saved eight avalanche victims. Circling over the scene, he noticed a ski sticking out of the snow. He went down immediately, dug out a villager alive and flew him to hospital. He returned with a dog train and seven more were freed alive.

Saving lives is only a sideline for Geiger, who runs the small civil airport of this medieval Rhone Valley town. His main job is flying supplies to isolated cab-

ins, snowbound villages or high-altitude power projects.

**SUPPLIES MERRYMAKERS**

Sometimes Geiger lands on a 10,000-foot-high glacier just to deliver a few bottles of mineral water. Or he takes a baby carriage to the wife of a cabin keeper. Or he risks his life so that a merry group of mountain tourists can throw a wine-drinking party.

He also teaches scores of Swiss and foreign students the art of glacier landing.

"Our glaciers and snow fields are the best airports nature could give to us," Geiger says. "Why shouldn't we use them?"

Geiger has fitted his Piper Cub with skis, operated by a hydraulic lift of his own design so that he can take off on wheels but land on the snow crust.

Geiger has landed on more than 2,000 different fields, some less than 200 feet long and 100 feet wide. His highest landing was made on the 14,421-foot Monte Rosa Glacier.
